Introduction

In November of 2008 University of Wisconsin System Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs Rebecca Martin instructed Associate Vice President of Academic and Faculty Programs Stephen Kolison to lead an effort to review the entire undergraduate program array of the UW System with the overall goal of assessing the viability and productivity of each program in terms of enrollments and degree production.

This initiative was precipitated by the fiscal outlook of the state and represents an effort on the part of Administration to keep the UW System institutions strong and responsive to the needs of the state in what is expected to be a period of extraordinary budgetary challenges.

The resulting assessment was intended to provide System institutions with information that would assist them in making decisions regarding their program arrays in such a period and beyond, while taking into consideration the capacity of the entire System to offer needed programs to students. Thus, this work included the development of guiding principles that encourage the coordination among UW System institutions of decisions relating to the elimination or merger of degree programs. This, in the view of the working group, would ensure that the same majors are not removed everywhere, and that the UW System will continue to provide the citizens of Wisconsin with a broad range of high-quality academic programs while making the best use of our limited resources.

To carry out this project, a working group consisting of provosts, faculty, and staff from System Administration was appointed. The members of this working group are as follows:

The working group proceeded to:

- 1) Develop a set of guiding principles for program realignments/discontinuations/eliminations;
- 2) Produce a clear and informative picture of the current UW System program array;
- 3) Collect and analyze data on enrollments and degrees conferred from the program array during the last six to ten years, including:
 - a. an analysis for each institution of the contribution of each program in their array to total degree production; and
 - b. highlighting low degree producing areas systemwide;
- 4) Disseminate the data and analyses to all UW System Provosts to obtain feedback and input;
- 5) Compile information on how institutions plan to use or are using the data;
- 6) Conduct a survey to gather data concerning programs throughout the system that are inactive but still on the books either:
 - a. awaiting some form of reactivating or closure decisions; or
 - b. planned for closure; and
- 7) Share the results of the working group's efforts with all UW System Provosts, the UW System President's Cabinet, and others within UW System involved in Academic Program Planning and Review for more feedback and input.

The data for this report was provided in large part by the UW System Administration's Office of Policy Analysis and Research (OPAR).

In this report, a section on "Looking Ahead" is included. The questions in the "Looking Ahead" section were originally posed by the chair to the members of the working group to obtain feedback on whether the scope of work for the group should be expanded to include a study of those questions. No consensus was reached. Nevertheless, that did not prevent the working group from fulfilling the initial goals of this effort.

So What?

Examples of how UW institutions are utilizing program realignment data

UW-Madison:

Jocelyn Milner: “You asked how the System data was used. Based on the increased interest in reviewing the program array early in 2009 we prepared a web page on low-enrollment programs to supplement the information already provided. Deans were asked to refer to this site and to consider their academic programs in light of student enrollments and faculty participation. The System trend data for UW-Madison was provided to the schools and colleges through this web page.

In addition to program deletions, program reorganization and merger is an important way we renew and evolve our program array and some important program mergers are listed at the above web page.

It is worth highlighting that the decision to discontinue the BS-Clinical Laboratory Sciences program came out of an intentional review by the School of Medicine and Public Health of all of their program offerings. Although it is a successful program, SMPH decided to discontinue because it duplicates programs elsewhere in the System and because the School deemed it important to focus on graduate and professional education. The System data let us see that there were several other UW CLS/Med Tech programs with strong enrollments.

Since the 1970's UW-Madison has undertaken an annual review of low-enrollment academic programs. Because we give this issue annual attention, we have very few programs that are inactive that haven't been formally discontinued. We do require a governance action to suspend admission to academic programs and so we fairly good records on which programs are inactive. Those "suspend admissions" actions provide a three-year window for the program to be reviewed and rejuvenated or, in the absence of other action, discontinued. The only program we have on the books is "in storage" is the MFA in Dance (Department of Kinesiology, School of Education), to which no students are admitted and no plans exist (that I know of) for a change in the program's status.”

UW-Whitewater:

Chris Clements: Below is an excerpt from an e-mail to deans that will guide a discussion to take place among the deans, associate vice chancellor for student affairs and provost after July 1:

“I wanted to touch base about the program realignment discussion we had at last Thursday’s Deans Council Meeting. After the meeting, I asked Barb if she would be able to pull together outcomes from the last 3-5 years of Audit and Reviews including a listing of programs that are behind in submitting their reports. She said we make annual reports to UW System so that shouldn’t be a problem. ...

... As discussed at our meeting, please share them with your Administrative or Chairs Council and engage them in discussion. Some of the questions and issues I would suggest you address are:

1. Are the program enrollments healthy?
2. If the numbers are small, what are the reasons? Does it make sense to have a major in this area? Why or why not?
3. Are there artifacts in your curriculum left from previous days? Have you developed other kinds of tracks or emphases that render parts of your curriculum obsolete?
4. Are there programs that should be in your curriculum rather than and/or in addition to those that currently exist?
5. Are issues about curriculum and program quality, currency and demand addressed each year as part of your department and college staffing proposals?
6. Does your administrative/chairs council track or discuss Audit and Review outcomes?
7. Do you have programs that have not fared well in the A&R process? Why or why not? Are there any implications related to the A&R outcomes for resource allocations (e.g., staffing, additional initiative support)?
8. Do you have programs that are behind in submitting their Audit & Reviews? What outcomes do you think are appropriate for programs that don’t complete the System required reviews in a reasonable timeframe (e.g., withhold hiring and/or curriculum change requests)?

**Tennessee Higher Education Commission
Low-Producing Program Criteria**

1. Programs central to general education are not included in review.
2. New programs created within the previous five year period are not included (these are reviewed annually through Tennessee Higher Education Commission's post-approval monitoring reports until the first cycle has been completed).
3. Programs in phase-out status are not included.
4. Programs classified as areas of critical demand in the next decade are not included.
 5. **Low-producing is defined** as follows:
 - a. Associate degree – avg. <10 graduates per year over the previous 5-year period
 - b. Baccalaureate degree – avg. <10 graduates per year over the previous 5-year period
 - c. Master's degree – avg. <5 graduates per year over the previous 5-year period
 - d. Doctoral degree – avg. <3 graduates per year over the previous 5-year period
 - e. All certificates – avg. <10 graduates per year over the previous 5-year period

Programs not meeting the degree/certificate generation criteria above take on the designation of "Low Producing Program" and are placed on "Monitoring" status.

**Proposed Guiding Principles for Program
Realignments/Discontinuations/Eliminations**

Preamble

In developing these proposed guiding principles, the Program Realignment Initiative Working Group researched, discussed and drew from various sources including: a) the previous work done within the UW System in 1986 by the (then Vice Chancellor) Wimberly Program Array Committee; b) some of the institutions of higher education who have developed and made public procedures or criteria for program closures; as well as c) the work of scholars such as Peter Eckel (2002)¹ and Robert Dickeson (1999)². Unlike the systems of higher education in some states, such as Florida and Tennessee³, every institution within the UW System has its own mechanism governing changes to its program array.

These guidelines were developed with the view that the interests of the citizens of Wisconsin would be best served if program closures or realignments decisions by the individual institutions of the UW System were made taking into account the need and the capacity of the System as a whole to continue to offer such programs. However, this view is in no way intended to interfere with the responsibility of individual institutions to make program realignment, discontinuation, or elimination decisions in accordance with their governance structure. Rather, this set of guiding principles should be seen as an additional resource for campuses to utilize as appropriate in arriving at such decisions.

Guiding Questions

1) How would we in the UW System approach decisions regarding program realignments?

Establish criteria to be used in the assessment or review of programs. The process of establishing these criteria should include representation from as many stakeholder groups as is feasible, and the established criteria of assessment should be widely known by the campus community. Examples of such criteria may include the following:

- a) Need for the program
 - Demand as may be defined by:
 - Applications, admissions, and enrollment;
 - Linkages of the program to other programs within the institution;
 - Role of the program in the UW System; and
 - Role or contributions of the program to the local, regional, state, or national economy.

- Special attributes of the program:
 - Uniqueness of the program – is it the only one of its kind in the region, state, or nation?
 - Is the program essential to the institution’s mission, its academic plan, or its strategic plan?
 - How many similar programs exist in the region or state?
 - Is the program part of a political or legislative mandate?
 - b) Program cost and productivity
 - What is the cost for operating this program relative to other programs within the institution?
 - What is the cost for operating this program relative to similar programs across the system?
 - Does the institution have an established minimum average annual degree production requirement for degree programs? If so, what is the performance of the concerned program relative to this requirement?
 - Is there a significant amount of research output (if applicable)?
 - Does the program provide support services to other programs at the institution?
 - Does the program attract external funding to the institution?
 - c) Program quality
 - What is the standing of this program compared to other programs within the institution and relative to similar programs across the system in regards to:
 - Physical and financial resources?
 - Faculty?
 - Accreditation?
- 2) What are other steps that will need to be taken in order to go forward with program realignment/discontinuation/elimination efforts?
- a) Determine an appropriate and flexible measure of degree productivity (that takes into account institutional enrollments, program array, etc.).
 - b) Sort out those programs that warrant assessment due to a low level of activity, low productivity, and/or high cost as defined by the institution.
 - c) For each of these programs, conduct a self assessment that includes consideration of the following:
 - Why was the program initially established (its history)?
 - Was it provided a reasonable level of resources to ensure its success (degree of investment)?
 - Was it provided the appropriate leadership to ensure its success?

- Can the level of activity or productivity be raised and/or the costs be lowered within a specified period of time by making some changes or by reconfiguring it (combining it with another program)?
 - d) Share with other provosts across the system intent to shelve or suspend program, combine program with another, or eliminate program.
- 3) Before making the decision to reconfigure, discontinue, or eliminate a program, what other considerations (including political) must be taken into account?
- a) Impacts on students, faculty, and staff
 - How will students be affected and what accommodations will be made?
 - How will faculty and staff be affected and what accommodations will be made?
 - b) Political, socio and cultural impacts
 - Extent of political support for the program within the community, region, and state.
 - Extent of minority and women enrollment in the program.
 - Does the program serve equity, diversity and inclusivity goals?
 - c) Economic impacts
 - The extent of job losses, if any.
 - The extent of impact on local business.
 - The amount of external funding that could be lost.
- 4) Who should be involved in making such decisions and to what degree?
- a) Shared governance
 - Faculty
 - Academic Staff
 - Students
 - System Administration
 - b) Consultative
 - Staff
 - Alumni
 - Other stakeholders
