



UW SYSTEM FACTS

ENROLLMENT

- 169,706 students enrolled in the fall 2006 semester.
- More than one-fifth (37,745) of UW System students are 25 years of age and older.

ACCESS

- 32% of students graduating high school in Wisconsin in 2005 enrolled at a UW System campus for fall 2005.
- In 2005-06, UW System institutions offered 1,755 distance education courses.

DEGREE TRENDS

- In 2005-06, the UW System conferred 30,587 bachelor's, master's, doctoral, and professional degrees.
- Women earned 57.3% of degrees in 2005-06.
- 64.2% of 2000 full-time new freshmen graduated in six years or less.

FINANCIAL AID

- A total of 105,523 students received some form of financial aid in 2005-06.
- In 2005-06, federal sources provided 77% of financial aid.
- The Pell Grant program provided \$62.3 million to 25,598 Wisconsin resident undergraduates in 2005-06.
- 22% of resident undergraduates received a Pell Grant in 2005-06. The average grant was \$2,434.
- The average loan debt for a Wisconsin resident who had loan debt at graduation and received a bachelor's degree in 2005-06 was \$19,809.
- The student loan default rate for the UW System was 1.6% in fiscal year 2004, well below the national average of 5.1%.



WiSys – An Overview of Activities

WiSys is a non-profit technology transfer organization designated by the UW System to promote research and development by moving university discoveries to industry through intellectual property protection and marketing. WiSys resources are available to all UW System faculty, staff and students. WiSys also provides patenting and licensing services to Marshfield Clinic scientists, and facilitates collaborations between University and Clinic researchers.

Major functions of WiSys include:

- Assessment of inventions and patent protection of marketable discoveries;
- Broad commercialization of technologies and sharing of income with inventors, campuses, and UW System administration;
- Encouraging innovation and intellectual property education;
- Assistance with inter-campus research collaboration;
- Assistance with technology-based business growth in Wisconsin.

WiSys was founded in 2000 and, as of January 2007, had received a total of 220 inventions from UW System campuses.

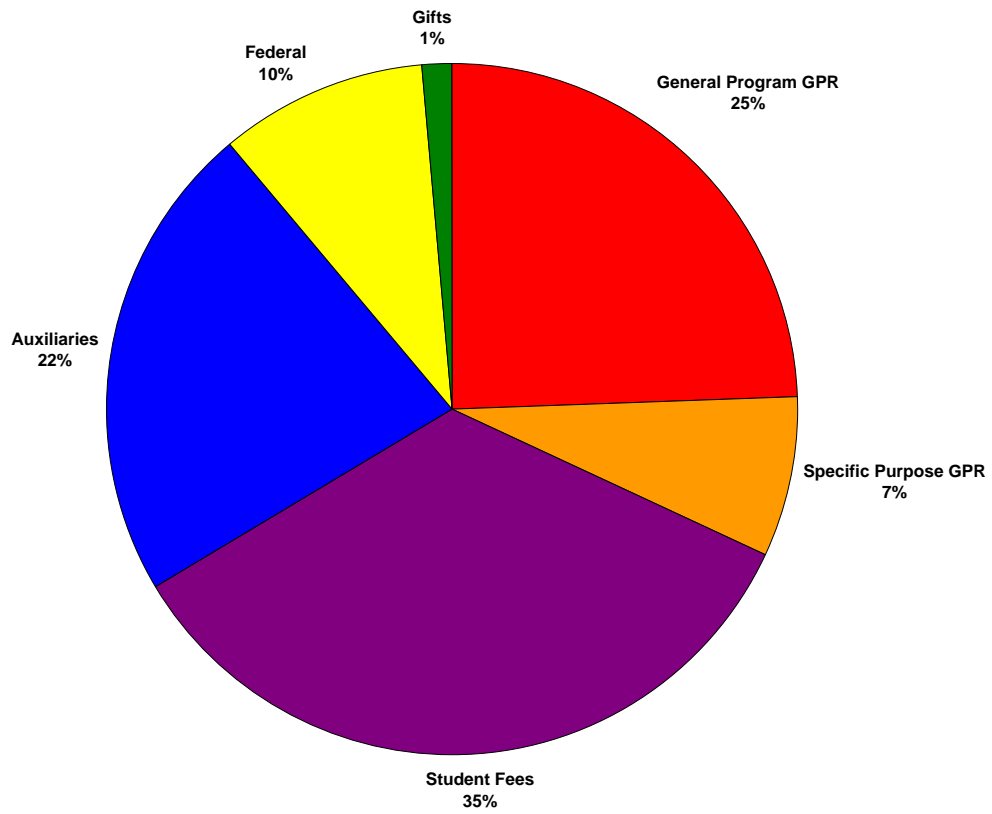
About 50 of these inventions are being protected with patents pending and have advanced to marketing status. WiSys also proactively identifies faculty and scientists with suitable expertise that may be useful in developing marketable technologies. About 500 faculty members and scientists have been contacted about the services WiSys has to offer and have been encouraged to develop inventions. WiSys is also working with the UW System Office of Federal Relations to bring together faculty, scientists and industry together, and to encourage them to apply for UW System, state and federal grants.

Highlights of 2006 activities include:

- Generation of 36 agreements from licensing activities in 2006, moving the technologies further down the licensing pipeline;
- Signed partnership agreement with Marshfield Clinic for WiSys to manage the Clinic's intellectual property and facilitate research and development collaborations with UW System faculty;
- Signed a Memorandum of Agreement allowing WiSys to manage the UW System Applied Research Grant, which supports applied research activities to benefit the economy of Wisconsin;
- Secured a \$1 million gift from the Wisconsin Alumni Research Foundation for technology development at UW System campuses and worked to leverage additional funding;
- Signed an agreement with the Academic ADL Co-Lab, a federally-funded endeavor, for technical and marketing advice for WiSys IT technologies; and
- Developed relationships with private firms, business and industry.

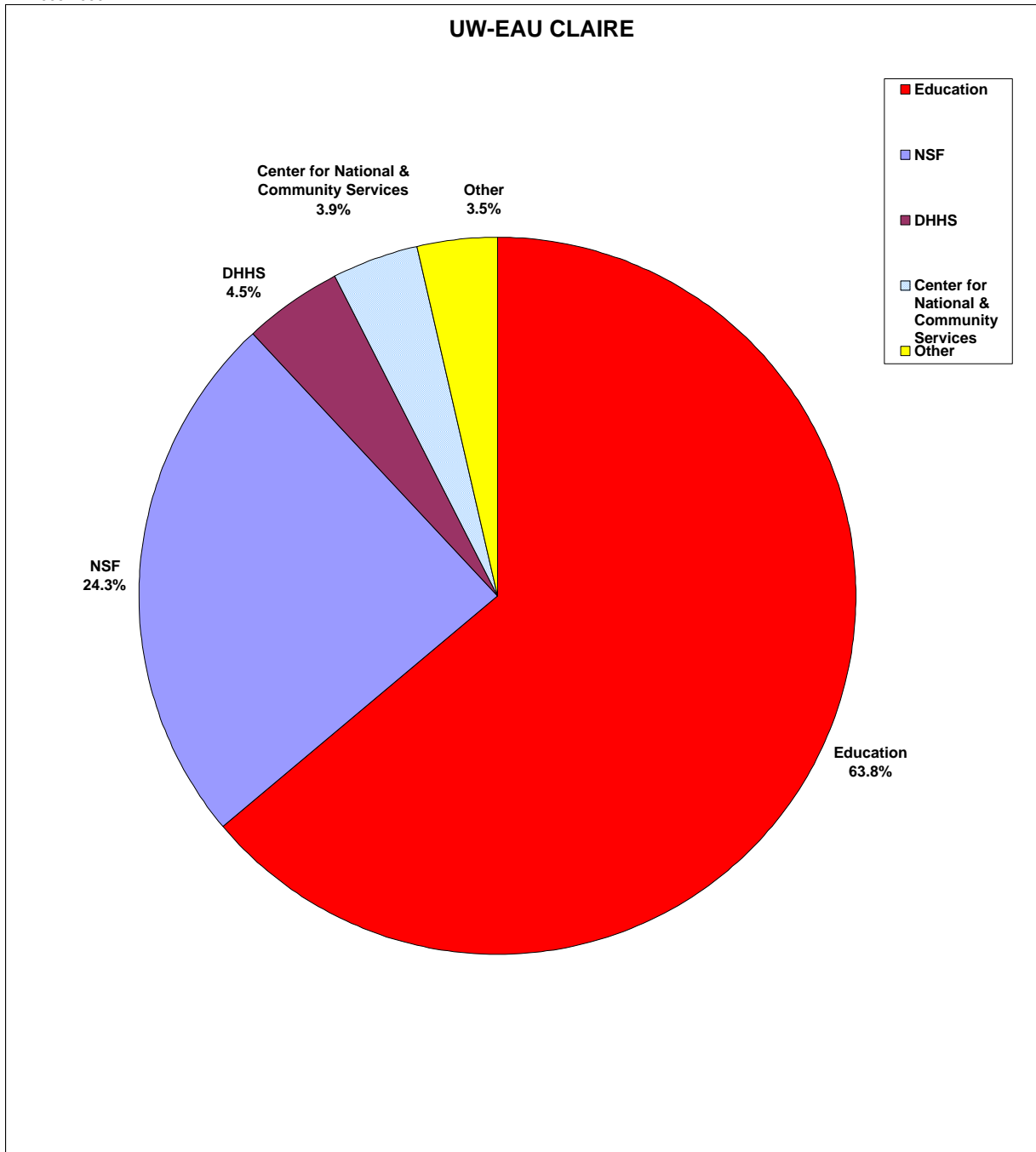
