- **ePortfolio**

We are trying to self-post the pilot rather than have it hosted at D2L. Lorna is working with D2L on the contract. Working with utility to access to the ePortfolio and feature activation.

Are currently negotiating 1500 user licenses for one year. System will pay for pilot licenses.

Lorna will look into how/if teachers not registered on a UW-Campus can participate. Currently faculty have to be registered within the UW system.

Lorna is asking for additional training sessions than currently being offered.

- **LTDC Rep List**

The list is currently pretty big (30). We have 15 institutions. It is a bit confusing. Requests are coming in to add more individuals. Lorna is going to clean up the list. She will only put the 15 reps on the list. The official rep will need to pass

along to others as needed. She asks the communications committee to come up with a better solution to requests.

- **D2L Purge Archive**

Retentions/Purge policy – A number of people were involved with the writing of the policy.

Purge: The complete removal of that item with no hope of bringing it back.

Two elements to the policy – Student contributions (will be retained for 1 semester) and Entire Courses (will be retained for 2 Years)

- **Digital Marketplace report from ITMC meeting**

FYI

Jack Gunther, CSU, spoke about the Digital Market Place. Allows faculty to build content via selection of non-commercial materials. Faculty assembles the course materials content, as they need it. Students get a list of the materials.

Faculty have the flexibility to take only what is needed in their course.

It is affordable and assessable content.

508 compliant and 24/7 accessibility

Needs a robust federated service

text publishers buy inwilling to sell materials

CSU is looking for partners to get the federated search part of it going.

Tennessee board of regents and Michigan has agreed to partner with CSU to build these components.

There is a lot of overhead to get it going, but is a good concept. There is a lot of potential.

Concern was expressed about the desire for faculty to be involved and who would be the point person on each campus.

Faculty can pick and choose objects, chapters...only what they need.

Faculty get compensated when their objects are used by other faculty (can be faculty from anywhere).
