1. QM training - UW Baraboo May 27 (Lorna)

Applying the QM Rubric training. Currently we have 31 registered. Information to attendees has been sent. If you have faculty who have questions have them get in touch with Lorna.

Train-the-Trainer training – 6 campuses. 6 – 7 participants took the training. Participants can only train on their own campus. Would like a group to get together this summer to talk about training on various campuses to build QM expertise across the UW-System.

2. Digital Story Telling (Cheryl)

Campuses are progressing nicely. Current action on bringing DST to the various campuses is taking place in several different ways ranging from one-hour information sessions to intense 3.5 day workshops.

Two teleconferences are set up as a means to offer campuses time to collaborate and share ideas and strategies for workshop development.

Last weeks teleconference generated discussion around how personal opinion ties into instructional objectives, what technologies are being used and lessons learned from those who have already experienced a workshop. Resources and workshop materials were also shared.

The next teleconference is scheduled for Friday, May 29, 9AM. Encourage your award faculty to participate.

Cheryl will present at this years NMC conference in Monterey, California with Joe Lambert and Liv Gjestvang. A section of her presentation will include reference to the LTDC grant and how it helped to support DST in higher education across the state of Wisconsin.

3. SL - UWS island (Lorna/Pat)

Learning Innovations, now CEOEL, has an island that is up for renewal. LI may not want to continue the campus. Does UW-System have an interest in taking over the island? Pat fellows/UW-colleges is interested in working on finding the island a home. Conversations between LI and UW-colleges will take place and submit a plan/proposal once more information is gathered.

(\$1,700 one-year contract) Will give campuses a chance to test it out.

Each campus will have full access. A communication strategy to build within the environment will be determined. Faculty will work with an LTDC rep and bring in a class.

4. LOR survey results and task force activity (Andy)

The questions were around the importance of using digital assets in their (faculty) teaching and where to faculty look to obtain digital objects?

All campuses responded, 910 responses. The results are still being aggregated. The task force is reviewing the data and will also be reexamining the repository that is through D2L.

5. Communication committee update (Andy)

Committee will be meeting soon to discuss communication needs.

6. e-pedagogy update (Lorna)

Three campus sessions are recorded. These sessions will be posted on the LTDC website for viewing. The communication committee will be discussing how to promote these sessions. Lorna will send out the link once the sessions are posted.

7. Fall LTDC conference update (Pat)

In Madison, at the Pyle Center. Dates still need to be determined. October 29 & 30 are the tentative dates. Are in the process of determining a theme and speakers. The focus is on pedagogy and 21st century literacy's (Pedagogy for the 21st literacy's). Topics may include: breakout LTDC groups will be more specific technologies.

Submit speaker suggestions to Pat or Lorna. Speakers will be accepted by invitation of the committee and not by proposal submission.
