**"Time Saving Features of Quizzing Using D2L"** - **Janet McKnight**, UWSP Business/Economics  
Prior to adopting D2L quizzing, students took paper copy quizzes that were hand graded with partial credit given on some questions. Utilizing the quizzing functions of D2L provides the capability of switching from a very labor intensive to an efficient approach to administering and grading quizzes. This presentation will focus on the time savings that have been achieved and demonstrate how one faculty uses these quizzes in her classes.
