Retention and Graduation: 2014-15

Highlights

UW System vs. National Public Four-Year Institutions

- Retention rates at the same UW institution for new freshmen entering full-time in fall 2013:
 - o 82.1% in UW System vs. 79.9% at public four-year institutions nationally.
 - An additional 4.4% continued at another UW System institution for a systemwide rate of 86.5%.
- Six-year graduation rates at the same UW institution for new freshmen entering full-time in fall 2008:
 - o 60.7% in UW System vs. 57.7% at public four-year institutions nationally.
 - An additional 5.5% graduated from another UW System institution for a systemwide rate of 66.2%.

UW New Freshmen Entering Full-Time in Fall

- Retention rates at the same UW institution for new freshmen entering full-time in fall 2013:
 - o 82.5% of females and 81.6% of males.
 - o 74.8% of underrepresented minorities.
 - o 76.1% of Pell Grant recipients.
- Six-year graduation rates at the same UW institution for new freshmen entering full-time in fall 2008:
 - o 63.0% of females and 58.0% of males.
 - o 42.5% of underrepresented minorities.
 - o 49.4% of Pell Grant recipients.

UW New Transfer Students Entering Full-Time in Fall

- Retention rate at the same institution for new transfer students entering full-time in fall 2013: 76.5%.
- Six-year graduation rate at any UW institution for new transfer students entering full-time in fall 2008: 67.2%.

Graduation and Continued Study Beyond the UW System

- Of UW new degree-seeking students entering full-time in fall 2008, the following either graduated from or were still enrolled in a U.S. college or university at the beginning of fall 2014:
 - o 79.0% of new freshmen.
 - 76.9% of new transfer students.

UW SYSTEM COMPARED WITH NATIONAL PUBLIC FOUR-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

Retention rates and graduation rates are two ways of measuring student persistence through college and successful completion of a degree. Retention to the second year and graduation with a bachelor's degree within six years are standard national metrics calculated for cohorts of new freshmen entering full-time in the fall semester. While the UW System's performance on these metrics compared to public four-year institutions nationally is favorable overall, graduation rates by race/ethnicity lag the national average for some individual student populations.

Retained to the Second Year

Of the 25,014 UW System new freshmen who entered full-time in fall 2013, 20,541 or 82.1 percent returned to the same UW institution the following fall. This rate was higher than the most recently available national average for public four-year institutions, 79.9 percent. The UW System retention rate has exceeded the national average each year since national data were first systematically collected on the fall 2003 entering class.




Figure 1/Table 1 **New Freshmen Enrolling Full-Time in Fall Semester**

Graduated Within Six Years

To compare with national average graduation rates, the UW System calculates six-year graduation rates for full-time new freshmen who graduate at the same UW institution at which they started. The UW System also calculates graduation rates for full-time new freshmen who graduate from any UW institution, since an important part of the UW System's mission is to facilitate transfer among UW institutions.

The most recent entering class for which six-year graduation rates can be computed is fall 2008. Of the 25,708 UW new freshmen entering in fall 2008, 60.7 percent (15,597 students) graduated with a bachelor's degree from the same UW institution by the end of summer 2014. An additional 5.5 percent (1,433 students) transferred and graduated from another institution in the UW System during the same period, for a systemwide graduation rate of 66.2 percent.

Fall 2007 is the most recent entering class for which national data are available. For that entering class, the UW System's same-institution graduation rate, 59.3 percent, exceeded the national public four-year institution average, 57.7 percent. Female students had a higher same-institution graduation rate than males, both in the UW System (61.8% versus 56.5%) and nationally (60.3% versus 54.6%). The UW System rate exceeded the national average for both males and females. See Appendices A and B for details.

Graduation rates of UW students of color are below those of UW students overall. African American males in the fall 2007 UW new freshman class had the lowest same-institution graduation rate, 29.6 percent, followed by American Indian males at 32.4 percent. Graduation rates of UW students of color as a whole lag behind those of students of color nationally and for all race/ethnicities except for American Indian females and Hispanic/Latino males. The gap was largest for Asian males, where the UW rate of 49.5 percent was 15.2 percentage points lower than the national average. Southeast Asians, a group that typically has greater obstacles to success in higher education than other Asian Americans, account for this difference. Although national data on graduation rates do not distinguish among Asian race/ethnicities, Southeast Asians comprise a significantly greater proportion of Asian American college students in Wisconsin than nationally¹.



UW SYSTEM NEW FRESHMEN ENTERING FULL-TIME IN FALL

Retention and graduation rates are influenced by student and institutional characteristics. Student characteristics include academic preparation, educational goals, and financial circumstances. Institutional influences on retention and graduation rates include educational requirements; academic support programs, such as tutoring or academic advising; and educational practices that foster student engagement, such as student learning communities. Variations in retention and graduation rates among UW institutions reflect differences in institutional practices and in the student population that each institution serves.

Retained to the Second Year

Full-time new freshmen entering in fall 2013 returned for the second year to the same UW institution at a rate of 82.1 percent. This is an increase of 1.4 percentage points from the fall 2012 cohort and the highest ever recorded. An additional 4.4 percent of fall 2013 full-time new freshmen continued at another institution within the UW System in the second fall.

Within the UW System, retention rates of full-time fall new freshmen vary among UW institutions. The highest rate is at UW-Madison, where 95.4 percent of the fall 2013 entering class returned to UW-Madison the following fall. UW-La Crosse and UW-Eau Claire had the next highest retention rates, 85.6 percent and 82.4 percent respectively. See Appendices C, D, and E for retention rates of new freshmen entering UW Colleges.



Retained to the Second Year: Gender, Race/Ethnicity, and Pell Grant Recipients

Retention rates of full-time fall new freshmen vary by gender, race/ethnicity, and family income. Female new freshmen who entered full-time in fall 2013 returned to the same institution at a rate of 82.5 percent, above the rate of male students, 81.6 percent. Among domestic students, non-underrepresented minority students indicating two or more races had the highest retention rate of any race/ethnic group, 88.8 percent while African Americans had the lowest rate, 69.2 percent. Retention rates of all underrepresented minority groups were lower than the UW System average.

Pell Grant recipients identify students from lower income families. New freshmen who entered full-time in fall 2013 and received a Pell Grant during their first year returned for the second year at a rate of 76.1 percent, below the rate of non-recipients, 84.3 percent. Graduated at the Same UW Institution Within Four Years

The majority of UW bachelor's degree programs are designed to be completed in four years of full-time enrollment in fall and spring semesters. The systemwide four-year graduation rate at the same UW institution where started for full-time new freshmen has been increasing steadily in recent years, from 28.3 percent of fall 2006 cohort to 31.0 percent of fall 2010 cohort, the highest rate ever recorded.

Within the UW System, graduation rates of full-time fall new freshmen vary among UW institutions, with the highest at UW-Madison. Of full-time new freshmen entering UW-Madison in fall 2010, 56.4 percent graduated from UW-Madison within four years. UW-La Crosse had the second highest four-year graduation rate, 35.9 percent.

Graduated at the Same UW Institution Within Six Years

Of full-time new freshmen entering fall 2008, 60.7 percent earned a bachelor's degree at the same UW institution where started within six years. This is an increase of 1.4 percentage points from the fall 2007 cohort and the highest rate ever recorded.

Within the UW System, graduation rates vary among UW institutions, with the highest at UW-Madison. Of full-time new freshmen entering UW-Madison in fall 2008, 83.7 percent graduated from UW-Madison in six years. UW-La Crosse and UW-Eau Claire had the next highest same-institution six-year graduation rates, 68.4 percent and 68.2 percent respectively.

Graduated with an Associate Degree at UW Colleges Within Three Years

Graduation with an associate degree within three years is a standard national metric for full-time new freshmen entering two-year institutions. Although the primary mission of UW Colleges is to transfer students to four-year institutions, many students at UW Colleges earned an associate degree within three years. Of full-time new freshmen entering UW Colleges in fall 2011, 22.6 percent graduated with an associate degree at UW Colleges by the end of summer 2014. This is an increase of 2.6 percentage points from the fall 2007 cohort.

Many students at UW Colleges continued to earn their bachelor's degree at other four-year institutions. See Appendix M for graduation rates for new freshmen entering UW Colleges and earning a bachelor's degree at a UW four-year institution.



Graduated at the Same UW Institution Within Six Years: Gender, Race/Ethnicity, and Pell Grant Recipients

As with retention rates, graduation rates of full-time fall new freshmen vary by gender, race/ethnicity, and income. Female new freshmen who entered full-time in fall 2008 graduated at the same UW institution at a rate of 63.0 percent, above the rate of male students, 58.0 percent. Among domestic students, Asian American (non-Southeast Asian) students had the highest graduation rate, 65.9 percent. African Americans had the lowest rate, 34.1 percent. Graduation rates of all underrepresented minority groups were lower than the UW System average.

Pell Grant recipients identify students from lower income families. New freshmen who entered full-time in fall 2008 and received a Pell Grant during their first year graduated within six years at a rate of 49.4 percent, below the rate of non-recipients, 63.1 percent. Graduated at Any UW Institution Within Six Years

The systemwide six-year graduation rate at any UW institution for full-time new freshmen was 66.2 percent for the fall 2008 cohort. This is an increase of 1.2 percentage points from the fall 2007 cohort and the second highest rate ever recorded.

Within the UW System, graduation rates of full-time fall new freshmen vary among UW institutions. The highest rate is at UW-Madison, where 85.8 percent of the fall 2008 entering class graduated anywhere in the UW System within six years. UW-La Crosse and UW-Eau Claire had the next highest graduation rates, 77.3 percent and 75.5 percent respectively. See Appendices F, G, and H for graduation rates for new freshmen entering UW Colleges and earning a bachelor's degree at a UW four-year institution.

Retention Beyond the Second Year and Graduation Before Six Years

Although retention to the second year and graduation within six years are the most commonly-used measures, metrics over other time periods are also of interest. Retention to the third and fourth years provides information about continued persistence in college. Graduation within four years or five years shows how many new freshmen attain a bachelor's degree within the minimum number of years needed if enrolled full-time. The credits necessary to graduate from the majority of UW bachelor's degree programs can be earned within four years; for certain professional programs with additional requirements, five years is more common. Finally, the rate of continued enrollment in the seventh year, when added to the percent who graduated within six years, is a good predictor of the proportion of new freshmen who will eventually graduate in the UW System.

Of the new freshmen who entered the UW System full-time in fall 2008, 85.1 percent were retained to the beginning of the second year at any UW institution. In the third year, 77.9 percent of the fall 2008 entering class returned to a UW institution, followed by 73.4 percent in the fourth year. The largest decline in the proportion of students retained was between the first and second year (14.9 percentage points), followed by the second to third year (7.2 percentage points), and the third to fourth year (4.5 percentage points).

By the end of the fourth year, 30.3 percent of the fall 2008 class had graduated from a UW institution. This proportion almost doubled by the end of the fifth year to 59.1 percent. The graduation rate increased 7.1 percentage points to 66.2 percent between years five and six. At the beginning of the seventh year, 4.4 percent of the fall 2008 class had not attained a bachelor's degree and were still enrolled in the UW System. See Appendix M for details by UW institution.



UW SYSTEM NEW TRANSFER STUDENTS ENTERING FULL-TIME IN FALL

Retention and graduation rates are most commonly calculated for new freshmen entering full-time in fall semester. This population describes the majority of the new degree-seeking undergraduates entering UW System institutions each year, 63.5 percent during 2013-14. However, many new degree-seeking undergraduates transfer academic credits earned previously at another UW institution or elsewhere in higher education. During 2013-14, 18.0 percent of new degree-seeking undergraduates entered the UW System as full-time fall new transfers.

This section examines retention and graduation rates of new transfer students entering full-time in fall semester, by both the sending sector of higher education and the receiving UW institution. Retention and graduation rates of full-time fall new transfers also are included in each UW institution's Voluntary System of Accountability College Portrait, http://collegeportraits.org. Retained to the Second Year by Type of Sending Institution

Overall, 76.5 percent of new transfers entering the UW System full-time in fall 2013 returned to the same UW institution in fall 2014. Retention rates varied by the higher education sector previously attended. Retention rates were highest for new transfer students from within the UW System, with a rate of 81.8 percent for new transfers from UW Colleges, and 77.8 percent from UW four-year institutions. New transfers from Wisconsin private institutions were retained at the lowest rate, 73.3 percent.

Full-time new transfer students who enter fall semester with freshman class standing are less likely to return for the second year than students who enter with sophomore, junior, or senior standing. Of fall 2013 full-time new transfers who entered with freshman class standing, 62.7 percent returned to the same UW institution in the second fall, 16.2 percentage points below the retention rate of sophomore transfers and 19.7 percentage points below the rate of upperclassmen. 

Retained to the Second Year by Receiving Institution

Retention rates of new transfer students vary among UW institutions. New transfer students entering full-time in fall 2013 returned to UW-Madison at a rate of 90.4 percent. New transfer students at UW-Whitewater had the next highest retention rate, 80.1 percent. At UW Colleges, many students enter as new transfers for the purpose of taking one or two courses either while concurrently enrolled at a four-year institution or with the intention of returning to a four-year institution. As a result, the retention rate of new transfers at UW Colleges is lower than at UW four-year institutions. See Appendix J for details.

Graduated at the Same UW Institution Within Four Years by Receiving Institution

Of new transfer students entering the UW System full-time in fall 2010, 52.7 percent graduated from the same UW institution within four years. This is an increase of 0.4 percentage points from fall 2009. Four-year graduation rates of new transfers vary by UW institution. Of full-time new transfer students entering UW-Madison in fall 2010, 75.9 percent graduated from UW-Madison within four years. New transfer students at UW-Whitewater and UW-Stout had the next highest four-year graduation rates, 60.3 percent and 59.5 percent respectively.

Graduated at the Same UW Institution Within Six Years by Receiving Institution

The six-year graduation rate at the same UW institution for full-time new transfers has increased from 59.2 percent of the fall 2004 cohort to 62.4 percent of the fall 2008 cohort, the highest ever recorded. Graduation rates at the same UW institution vary among UW institutions. The highest is at UW-Madison, where 82.6 percent of fall 2008 entering new transfers graduated from UW-Madison by the end of summer 2014. UW-Platteville and UW-Stout had the next highest six-year graduation rates, 69.8 percent and 69.5 percent respectively.



Graduated at Any UW Institution Within Six Years by Type of Sending Institution

Of new transfers entering the UW System full-time in fall 2008, 67.2 percent graduated from a UW institution by the end of summer 2014. Graduation rates varied by the higher education sector attended prior to transfer. Graduation rates were highest for new transfer students from within the UW System, with a rate of 74.1 percent for new transfers from UW Colleges, and 73.5 percent from UW four-year institutions. New transfers from Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS) institutions graduated at the lowest rate, 58.0 percent.

Full-time new transfer students who enter fall semester with freshman class standing are less likely to graduate within six years than students who enter with sophomore, junior, or senior standing. Of fall 2008 full-time new transfers who entered with freshman class standing, 45.5 percent graduated from a UW institution within six years, 25.3 percentage points below the graduation rate of sophomore transfers and 32.1 percentage points below the rate of upperclassmen. 

Graduation rates of new transfer students vary among UW institutions. New transfer students entering full-time in fall 2008 at UW-Madison graduated from a UW institution within six years at a rate of 85.8 percent. New transfer students at UW-Stout had the next highest graduation rate, 71.9 percent. New transfers entering UW Colleges must transfer to a four-year institution to graduate with a bachelor's degree, resulting in a lower graduation rate than that of new transfers entering UW four-year institutions. GRADUATION AND CONTINUED STUDY BEYOND THE UW SYSTEM

Each of the 14 degree-granting institutions in the UW System has a distinctive mission and culture, which together offers a diverse array of academic programs that can be pursued on- and off-campus. Nevertheless, some students who enter the UW System seeking a college degree decide to continue their studies outside the UW System.

Of the new freshmen who entered the UW System full-time in fall 2008, 66.2 percent graduated with a bachelor's degree from a UW institution within six years and an additional 3.8 percent graduated from a non-UW institution in the United States, for a combined graduation rate of 70.0 percent. When combined with 4.4 percent still enrolled in the UW System and 4.6 percent still enrolled elsewhere in the United States, 79.0 percent of the fall 2008 full-time new freshmen class either graduated with a bachelor's degree or were still enrolled in college at the beginning of fall 2014.

Of the new transfer students who entered the UW System full-time in fall 2008, 67.2 percent graduated with a bachelor's degree from a UW institution within six years and an additional 3.8 percent graduated from a non-UW institution in the United States, for a combined graduation rate of 71.0 percent. When combined with 2.6 percent still enrolled in the UW System and 3.2 percent still enrolled elsewhere in the United States, 76.9 percent of fall 2008 full-time new transfer students either graduated with a bachelor's degree or were still enrolled in college at the beginning of fall 2014.



Technical Notes

- National data on retention and graduation rates are based on public four-year institutions, including
 military service schools but excluding four-year institutions in U.S. territories and outlying areas.
 National data on retention rates by gender and race/ethnicity are not available.
- The source of students graduated from or still enrolled at non-UW institutions is the National Student Clearinghouse, which includes 98 percent of all U.S. college students' enrollment and degree data. Similar data are reported in each UW four-year institution's Voluntary System of Accountability (VSA) College Portrait, http://collegeportraits.org/.
- Race/ethnicity is self-reported by the individual. Students who are non-resident aliens (temporary U.S. visa holders) are categorized as International. Students of color are defined as those not categorized as White, Unknown, or International. In some cases, Southeast Asians and other Asian Americans are reported as a single group for comparability with other data sources. Beginning in fall 2008, new race/ethnicity categories were implemented that allow entering students to self-identify as Hawaiian/Pacific Islander or as more than one race/ethnicity.
- New degree-seeking undergraduates include new freshmen and new transfer students. New freshmen are defined as students with no prior credit-earning enrollment at an institution of higher education, other than credits earned while in high school. New transfer students are defined as students with transferable academic credits from an institution of higher education, other than credits earned while in high school, but no prior enrollment at the UW institution of entry.
- Student classification is based on the total number of degree credits which may have been accumulated from one or more transfer institutions. In general, freshman students have 0-29 degree credits, sophomore students have between 30 and 59 degree credits, and upperclassmen have 60 or more degree credits.
- The sending sector of a new transfer student is based on the last college or university from which the student transferred prior to entering the receiving UW institution.
