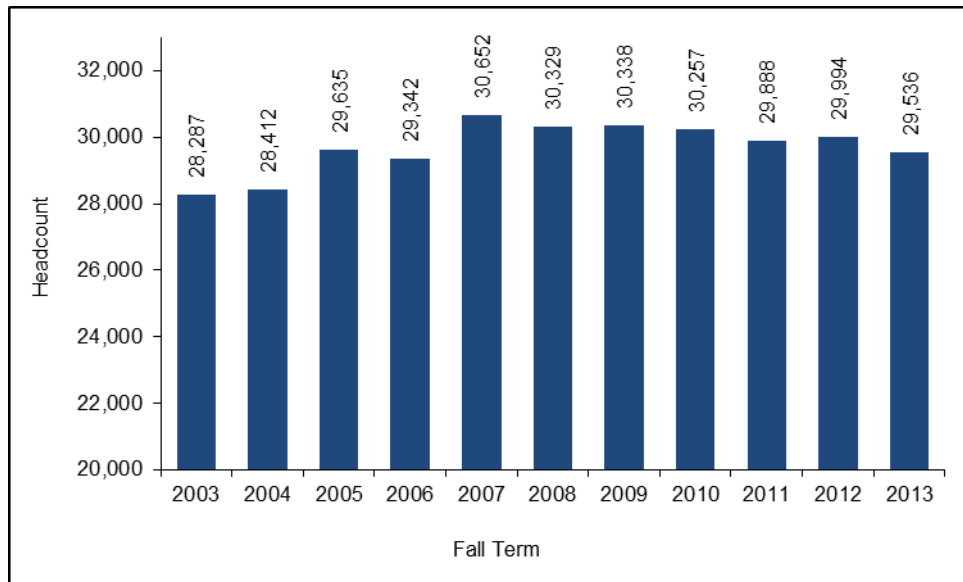

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APPLICATION AND ADMISSION

In fall 2013, 68,721 individuals applied to UW institutions as new freshmen. Among these individuals, 58,603 applicants submitted the required documents and fee to complete an application and 47,869 were admitted to at least one UW institution. A total of 29,536 new freshmen enrolled in the UW System in fall 2013.

The total number of new freshman applicants for fall 2013 has increased 29.6 percent from fall 2003 and 11.2 percent from fall 2008. The systemwide admission and yield rates declined slightly from ten and five years ago. See Appendix A for details.

Resident Status

The number of Wisconsin resident new freshman applicants decreased over the last few years while the number of non-resident applicants increased (Table 1). In fall 2013, 31,532 Wisconsin resident new freshman applicants completed an application, down from 34,342 in fall 2008. The number of non-resident applicants who completed an application was 19,762, almost twice the number in fall 2003. As a result, the proportion of non-resident applicants increased while the proportion of Wisconsin resident applicants decreased. The admission rates and yield rates for Wisconsin resident new freshman applicants stayed stable over the last decade and were the highest among all applicant groups. In fall 2013, Wisconsin resident new freshman applicants had an admission rate of 94.0 percent and a yield rate of 76.7 percent. Non-resident new freshman applicants had the lowest admission rates and yields rates in fall 2008 and fall 2013. Gender

Female applicants comprised 52.1 percent (35,798) of the new freshman applicants in fall 2013, while 47.9 percent (32,923) were male applicants (Table 2). The proportion of male applicants has increased over time, although the majority of applicants are still female. In 2003, 2008, and 2013, female applicants maintained a higher admission rate while admitted males maintained a higher yield rate. The admission and yield rates for both males and females in fall 2013 declined from ten and five years ago. See Appendix C for applications, admissions, and enrollment by gender and UW institution.

Underrepresented Minority (URM) Status

The proportion of underrepresented minority (URM) applicants increased from 8.2 percent to 15.3 percent and the proportion of non-URM applicants decreased from 88.9 percent to 74.1 percent from ten years ago (Table 3). The number of international applicants has more than quadrupled since 2003. The admission rate for URM applicants have decreased from ten and five years ago. In 2003 and 2008, URM applicants had higher admission rates than non-URM applicants while in 2013, URM applicants had lower admission rates than non-URM applicants. Non-URM applicants had a higher yield rate than URM applicants in 2003, 2008, and 2013. See Appendix D for applications, admissions, and enrollment by race/ethnicity and UW institution.

ENROLLMENT

Headcount

In fall 2013, 29,536 new freshmen enrolled in the UW System (Table 4). This is a decrease of 793 students (2.6%) from fall 2008 but an increase of 1,249 (4.4%) from ten years ago. The fall 2013 enrollment was down 458 students (1.5%) from fall 2012 and was down 1,116 students (3.6%) from fall 2007, when the highest number of new freshmen was recorded (30,652).

UW-Madison, UW Colleges, and UW-Milwaukee enroll almost half of the UW System new freshmen (Table 4). In fall 2013, the new freshman proportion of total institutional headcount enrollment ranged from approximately 12 percent at UW-Milwaukee, UW-Green Bay, and UW-Superior to 29.8 percent at UW Colleges. DEMOGRAPHICS

Resident Status

In fall 2013, 77.0 percent (22,747) of new freshmen were Wisconsin residents, 12.9 percent (3,809) were non-resident new freshmen, and the remaining 10.1 percent (2,980) were enrolled under the Minnesota or Michigan reciprocity agreements (Table 5). Non-resident students include those enrolled in tuition discount programs. In fall 2013, 347 new freshmen enrolled in UW-Platteville's Tri-State Initiative, 580 new freshmen enrolled in the Midwest Student Exchange Program, and 22 new freshmen enrolled in the Return to Wisconsin program. Combined, these programs accounted for 24.9 percent of non-resident new freshmen in fall 2013.

The proportion of non-resident new freshmen continues to increase and was 12.9 percent in fall 2013. The proportion of Wisconsin resident new freshmen continues to decrease over the last ten years. The proportion of new freshmen who enrolled under the Minnesota or Michigan reciprocity agreements was stable around 10 percent in the last decade (Table 6).

Gender

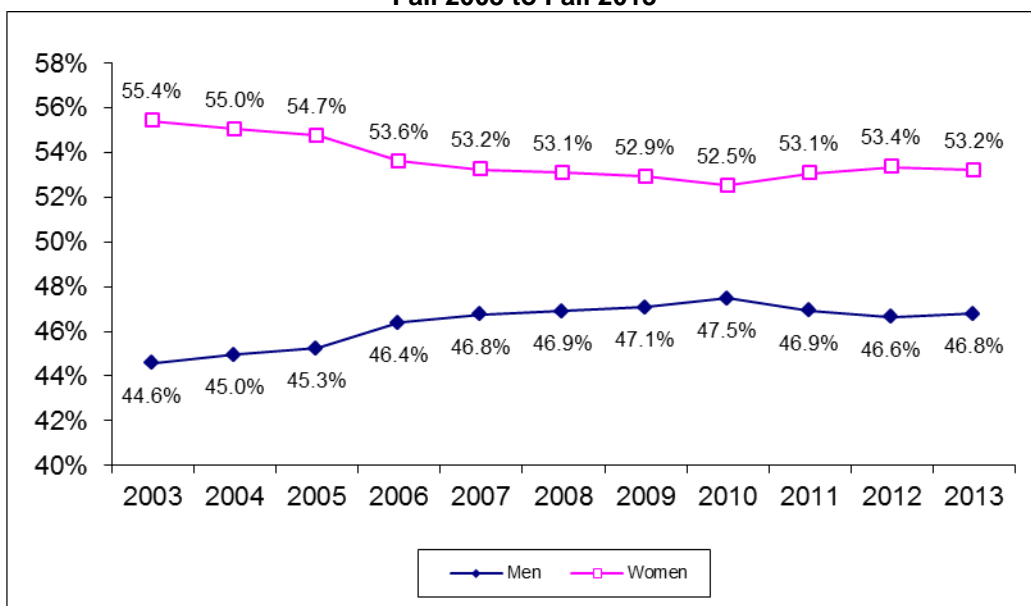
Female students comprised 53.2 percent of the new freshman class in fall 2013, while 46.8 percent were male students (Table 7). The percentage of female students ranged from 33.9 percent at UW-Platteville to 68.7 percent at UW-Green Bay.

Figure 1 shows the trend in new freshman enrollment by gender from fall 2003 to fall 2013. The gender gap between female and male students during the past ten years peaked in 2003 at 10.8 percentage points and had been declining between 2003 and 2010. The fall 2010 gender gap, 5.0 percentage points, was the smallest in the last decade. Female students have made up the majority of the UW System new freshman class since 1976.

Race and Ethnicity

In fall 2013, underrepresented minority (URM) students made up 12.7 percent (3,743) of the new freshman class, while 84.9 percent (25,075) of the incoming class were non-URM students. International students comprised 2.4 percent of fall 2013 new freshmen (Table 8). The proportion of URM new freshmen ranged from 6.5 percent at UW-Eau Claire to 27.2 percent at UW-Milwaukee.

The proportion of new freshmen in fall 2013 who were URM students was the highest ever recorded, 0.8 percentage points higher than fall 2012 and 5.8 percentage points higher than ten years ago. Among URM students, Hispanic/Latino(a) students were the largest group (1,483 or 5.0%), followed by African American students (900 or 3.0%).

Beginning in fall 2008, new freshmen were able to specify more than one race/ethnicity. Also, Hawaiian/Pacific Islander was added as a separate race/ethnicity category; prior to 2008, these students were included in the Other Asian group.

First Generation College Students

Students are identified as first generation college students if neither parent earned a four-year college/university degree. In fall 2013, 40.3 percent (11,908) of new freshmen were first generation college students (Table 10). UW Colleges (2,475), UW-Milwaukee (1,497), and UW-Madison (1,159) enrolled the largest number of first generation new freshmen. UW Colleges had the highest proportion of first generation college students (59.0%) in its new freshman class, followed by UW-Parkside (53.9%), and UW-Green Bay (52.0%). UW-Madison had the lowest proportion of first generation new freshmen (18.3%).

First generation new freshmen comprised 45.0 percent of all Wisconsin resident new freshmen in fall 2013. The proportion was 21.7 percent for non-residents and 28.5 percent for Minnesota or Michigan reciprocity students.

Wisconsin Covenant Scholars

The Wisconsin Covenant was created to inspire young people to plan early for a successful high school career that will lead to higher education. In fall 2013, 4,508 resident new freshmen in the UW System were Wisconsin Covenant scholars, representing 19.8 percent of total resident new freshmen (Table 12). UW-Madison enrolled the largest number of Covenant scholars (1,851), followed by UW-La Crosse (368) and UW- Eau Claire (348). UW-Madison had the highest proportion of Wisconsin Covenant scholars in its resident new freshmen (48.2%), followed by UW-Eau Claire (25.0%) and UW-La Crosse (22.8%).

Full-Time Status

The vast majority of UW new freshmen in fall 2013 (97.0%) were full-time students with a credit load of 12 or more credits (Table 16). UW Colleges had the highest proportion of part-time new freshmen (13.2%), followed by UW-Parkside (10.0%). UW-Eau Claire had the lowest proportion of part-time new freshmen (0.1%).

EDUCATIONAL PREPARATION

ACT Scores

Table 18 shows the average ACT composite scores of new freshmen by UW institution from fall 2003 to fall 2013. The average ACT composite score of fall 2013 new freshmen ranged from 28.1 at UW-Madison to 20.7 at UW Colleges. Of the 2,098 (7.1%) UW System new freshmen who did not provide an ACT score, 993 (3.4%) instead provided SAT scores. 522 (1.8%) students provided both ACT and SAT scores.

The UW System new freshman average ACT composite score of 23.6 is 2.7 test points higher than the national average of 20.9. Since 2003, the average ACT composite score of UW System new freshmen has ranged from 2.0 to 2.7 test points above the national average. In fall 2013, 67.1 percent of UW System new freshmen scored above the national average.

High School Rank

In fall 2013, 43.9 percent of UW System new freshmen graduated from high school in the top 25 percent of their high school class (Table 19). About three fourths (76.8%) of new freshmen graduated in the top half of their high school class. The percentage of UW System new freshmen graduating in the top 25 percent of their high school class was the lowest in fall 2013 over the last decade (Table 20). For UW institutions that collect high school rank, the proportion of new freshmen for whom a high school rank was not provided increased from 14.5 percent in fall 2003 to 32.3 percent in fall 2013; this proportion ranged from 17.8 percent at UW-River Falls to 44.8 percent at UW-Madison in fall 2013.

Class Standing

Many new freshmen enter a UW institution with Advanced Placement credits, with credits earned through the institution's placement testing process, or with college credits they earned while in high school. Some new freshmen have sufficient credits from these sources to qualify for sophomore or higher class standing. In fall 2013, the majority of UW System new freshmen (94.7%) enrolled with a class standing of freshman, while 5.3 percent entered with a sophomore or higher class standing (Table 21). UW-Madison had the largest proportion of new freshmen who entered with a sophomore or higher class standing (19.5%).

Remediation

Table 23 shows the proportion of fall 2013 new freshmen who were placed into math or English remediation. In fall 2013, 20.6 percent of UW new freshmen were placed into math remediation and 9.2 percent were placed into English remediation. UW-Milwaukee had the highest proportion of its new freshmen requiring math remediation (48.3%) while UW-Parkside had the highest proportion of its new freshmen requiring English remediation (28.5%).

The proportion of UW new freshmen placed into math remediation increased rapidly from 14.2 percent in 2003 to 21.6 percent in 2008 (Table 24). In the last five years, this proportion has declined every year to 20.6 percent in 2013. The proportion of UW new freshmen placed into English remediation in fall 2013 was the second highest over the last ten years, 0.7 percentage points lower than the proportion in fall 2012.
