### Overview

#### 12-month Enrollment Overview

The 12-month Enrollment component collects unduplicated student enrollment counts and instructional activity data for an entire 12-month period. Using the instructional activity data reported, a full-time equivalent (FTE) student enrollment at the undergraduate and graduate level is estimated (4-year institutions only). Institutions with Doctor's - professional practice students will also report the FTE enrollment of those students (4-year institutions only). NCES uses the FTE enrollment to produce indicators such as expenses by function per FTE as reported in the IPEDS Data Feedback Report.

#### Data Reporting Reminder:

- All institutions must use the July 1 - June 30 reporting period.
- Report data to accurately reflect the time period corresponding with the IPEDS survey component, even if such reporting is seemingly inconsistent with prior-year reporting. For example, if a summer term began later than usual due to Coronavirus Pandemic postponements, continue to report using the timeframes as defined in the IPEDS instructions. Reason	Although UW Flexible Option programs are open to first time students, they are designed and geared toward non-traditionally aged students (ave age in the 30's, working full-time, often with families). As such, most have some prior higher education before entering their UW Flexible Option program. First time students are therefore rare. Even more rare are first time students who enroll as full time students (12 or more credits); most Flexible Option students attend part time, which is more compatible with an older student population working full time. In conclusion, then, it is not unusual to have zero first-time, full time students in a particular gender.
