### Overview Admissions Overview

Welcome to the IPEDS Admissions (ADM) survey component. The primary purpose of ADM is to collect basic information about the undergraduate selection process for entering firsttime, degree/certificate-seeking students in the fall term. This includes information about admissions considerations, admissions yields, and SAT and ACT test scores (if test scores are used in admissions decisions). The ADM survey component is collected only from institutions that do not have an open admissions policy for entering first-time students, which is captured on the IC Header survey component.

#### **Data Reporting Reminders:**

Screen Entry	A majority of institutions have an admissions yield less than 80%. Please fix or explain. (Error #14306)	Explanation	Yes			
UW Flexible Option programs are specifically designed for non-traditionally aged college students (e.g., average age is 35). Most programs are degree-completion programs that specifically require prior college credits. Hence, first time students are exceedingly rare in UW Flexible Option programs (only one program allows for this category of student). As such, numbers of first time applicants, admits, and enrolled students will always be low for UW Flexible Option programs (unless, of course, Flexible Option offerings and policy changes in the future). Small numbers cause large effects on calculated percentages. The result was 83% this year, but due to small numbers, a student or two not enrolling in a subsequent year will result in a percentage well below 80%. In short, for Flexible Option programs, this is not a reliable measure.
