

Alice Pulvermacher is a Project Director and Principal Investigator in the University of Wisconsin System Office of Academic and Student Affairs. She was appointed to lead the UW System Math Initiative designed to improve student outcomes in mathematics and remove this barrier to retention and graduation. She secured a \$2.3 million grant to support this systemwide change initiative involving 13 four-year institutions and 13 two-year branch campuses, as well as coordination with Wisconsin's technical college, 4-year private and K-12 systems. She previously served as grant Project Director to document and disseminate the academic, operational, budgetary, communications and policy infrastructures essential for competency-based education.

Prior to joining UW System Administration, she was a Research Project Director in the UW-Madison College of Engineering from 2004 to 2014. She was responsible for implementation of individual and organizational change initiatives, including an \$8 million multi-state project with 200 private and public organizations. That was among several federal and private grants she managed during the past 16 years.

She earned a B.S. in project management from Michigan State University and an M.S. in adult education from UW-Madison.
