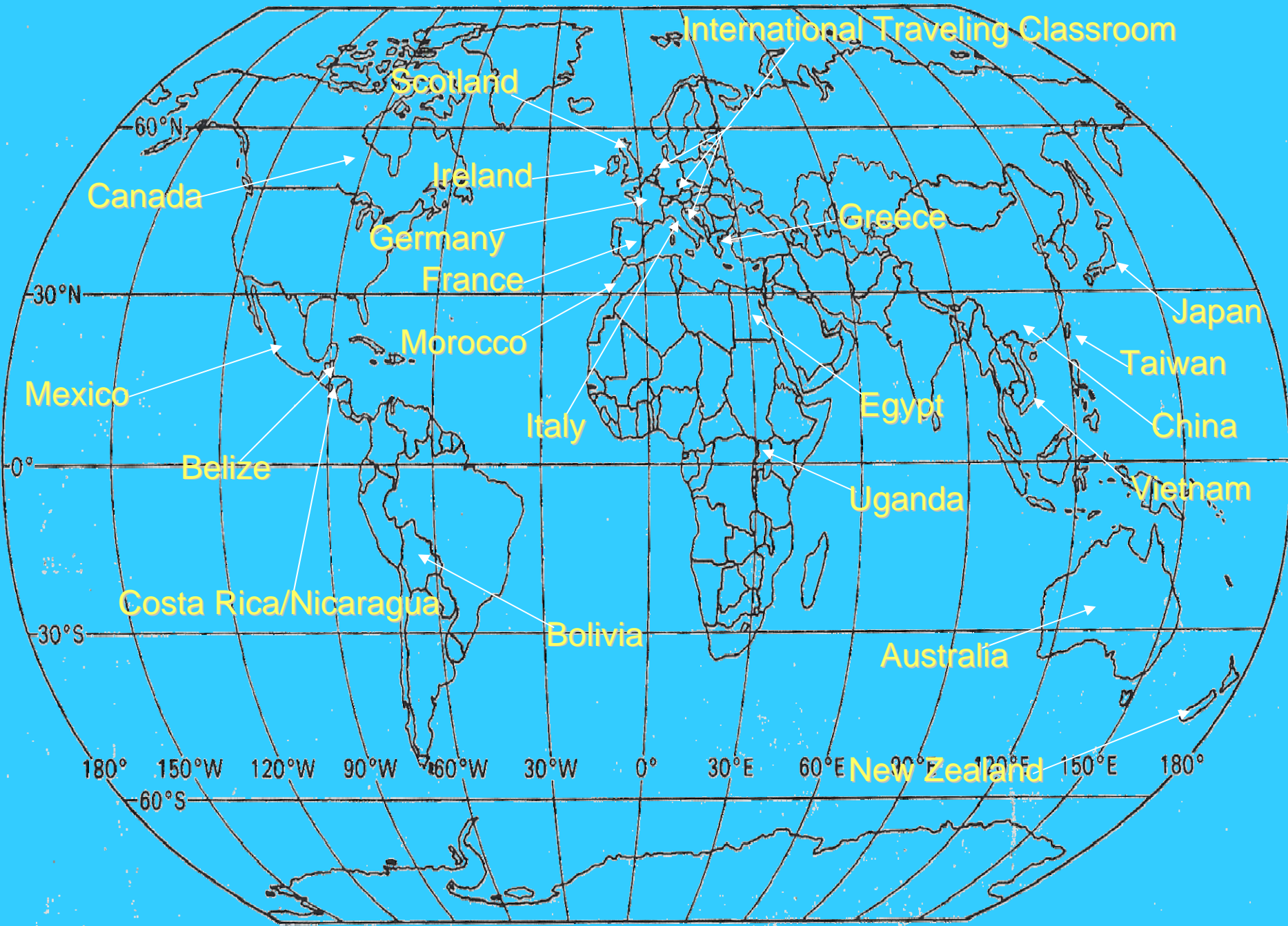

- Maximum 2 semesters per student
- Student pays tuition to Home institution
- Student responsible for all other expenses
- Exchange applications managed via the CONAHEC Information System, a private, secure on-line database
