- Alternative reaccreditation process established in 1999
- Focus on continuous quality improvement
- Requires annual reporting
- ▶ UW-Stout joined AQIP in 2002



Benefits of AQIP

- Reaccreditation as a process versus reaccreditation as an event
- Integration of reaccreditation activities with continuous improvement activities
- Increased campus involvement in reaccreditation process
- Campus can determine areas of focus



AQIP Criteria

- Helping students learn
- Understanding student and stakeholder needs
- Valuing people
- Leading and communicating
- Supporting institutional operations
- Measuring effectiveness
- Planning continuous improvement
- Building collaborative relationships
- Other distinct objectives



AQIP Process

- Organizational self assessment
- Strategy Forum (1st year)
- Action project updates (annually)
- Systems portfolio (4th year)
- Site visit (5th year)
- Re-accreditation (7th year)
- Cycle repeats...
