## Guiding Principles for New Accountability Report

- Organize around the Seven Core Strategies to Advantage WI
- Improve readability and "navigation"
- Continue to focus primary audience of Regents and legislators, with general public in mind
- Maintain approximately same number of accountability indicators
- 2009 report will be a transitional report

#### Prepare Students

Ensure that students are prepared with the integrative learning skills, multicultural competencies, and practical knowledge needed to succeed in and contribute to a rapidly changing, increasingly global society.

#### Access for Wisconsin High School Graduates

As part of the strategy to produce more graduates, the UW System provides access to Wisconsin high school graduates who enroll immediately after high school. The access rate is the proportion of Wisconsin high school graduates who enroll at a UW institution immediately following high school graduation.


Goal: Serve at least 32 percent of all Wisconsin high school graduates, overall and by race/ethnicity.

Status: "v/-" Mixed performance.

#### Highlights/Progress:

- In fall 2007, the UW System access rate was 33 percent, an increase of 8 percentage points since fall 1976.
- Since 1996, maintaining an access rate of at least 32 percent has resulted in an increase in the number of Wisconsin immediate new freshmen to keep pace with growing numbers of Wisconsin high school graduates.
- Wisconsin ranked 7th among states in access to public fouryear colleges and universities in 2006, the most recent year for which national data are available.

#### UW System Access Rates for Wisconsin immediate New Freshmen



#### Related Information:

- Access rates also differed by gender, primarily as a result of the lower application rate of male high school graduates (Appendix table xx).
- The cost of attending the UW System remained affordable relative to the national average (Appendix table xx).
- Access for low income students is reflected by the 21 percent of resident undergraduates who receive a Pell Grant (Appendix table xx).
- Ninety-four percent (94%) of Wisconsin applicants were admitted to at least one UW System institution where they applied. See "The New Freshmen Class" for more information:

#### **Prepare Students**

- Indicators and goals

  - Meet or exceed national average on students' <u>critical</u> <u>thinking</u>
  - Increase student <u>study away experiences</u>

  - Study away information by race/ethnicity



#### **More Graduates**

- Indicators and goals
  - Increase access for WI HS grads and enrollments
  - Increase retention and graduation rates
  - Increase degrees conferred (new)
- Related Information
  - Access: precollege, lower income, adult, distance ed
  - Retention: academic advising, intra-UW transfers
  - Degrees: WI educational attainment rates



## Well-Paying Jobs

- Indicators and goals
  - Increase federal and private research funding
  - Maintain contribution to Wisconsin economy
  - Increase degrees in <u>high-need/leading-edge fields</u> (<u>new</u>)
- Related Information
  - Examples of technology transfer
  - Examples from small-business development and entrepreneurial networks
  - Examples of impact on local economy



#### **Stronger Communities**

- Indicators and goals
  - Meet or exceed national average in students' <u>civic</u>
     <u>participation</u>
  - Increase contacts through <u>community outreach and</u> <u>education</u> (*new*)
- Related Information
  - Examples of service learning experiences
  - Examples of community outreach and education
  - Examples of other community-focused projects



#### Resources

- Indicator and goals
  - Increase total revenue (new)
  - Increase faculty and staff diversity
- Related Information

  - Examples of capital projects and maintenance funding



## Operational Excellence

- Indicators and goals
  - Remain below national average <u>administrative costs</u>
  - Reduce <u>energy usage</u> in campus facilities in accordance with DOA target
  - Maintain credits to degree below BOR target of 140
- Related Information
  - Examples of cost savings
  - Examples of energy-saving initiatives
  - Additional detail on credits to degree



#### Collaborations

- Indicator and goal
  - Increase the number of collaborative <u>academic degree</u> <u>programs</u>
- Related Information
  - Examples of collaborations with K-12 and other agencies
  - Articulation agreements with WI technical colleges
  - Student transfers from non-UWs



## Institutional Reports

- Common, systemwide indicators
  - Enrollments, retention & graduation, credits to degree
  - Critical thinking & civic participation
- Institution indicators
  - Mission specific
  - Equity Scorecard

## Background and Purpose

- Joint project of
  - the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU), and
  - the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges (NASULGC)
- LUMINA Grant Funded (2006)
- Increase Accountability to Stakeholders
  - Prospective students, families, and policy makers



## **UW System Commitment**

- November 2007
  - President Reilly and UWS Chancellors send letter of commitment to NASULGC and AASCU
  - Chancellors designate contact persons to facilitate communication with UWSA staff
- January 2008 to Present
  - Monthly teleconferences between campuses and UWSA
