

National and State Economy

- Nationally, unemployment rates are expected to remain generally unchanged
- GDP growth revised down
- Slow state and national recovery expected in 2010-11
- State GPR collections remained almost unchanged between FY2009 and FY2010




Other Considerations for the 2011-13 Biennial Budget

- \$2.5 billion structural deficit for 2011-13
- \$200 million Patient Compensation Fund decision
- Unlikely to see another federal stimulus bill



Biennial Budget Expectations

- Reduced the Research to Jobs proposal in half
- No proposal for a pay plan "catch up"
- Requested 75 percent of average state support for new enrollments
- No request to fund graduate enrollment growth
