## UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN-EAU CLAIRE STUDENT SENATE RESOLUTION

## IN SUPPORT OF THE WISCONSIN IDEA PARTNERSHIP

- WHEREAS, in the proposed 2011-2013 Biennial Budget, UW-
- 2 Madison and the rest of the UW System will receive a proposed
- 3 cut of \$250 million; and
- 4 WHEREAS, UW-Eau Claire is planned to receive an 11%
- 5 reduction in state aid; and
- 6 WHEREAS, these cuts will have a negative effect on the
- 7 University and the students of UW-Eau Claire if the UW System is
- 8 not given the tools to deal with the proposed cuts; and
- 9 WHEREAS, state funding received through block grants
- 10 instead of "silos" would provide substantial flexibility in
- 11 budgeting and allow the University to re-purpose funds to deal
- 12 with cuts; and
- 13 WHEREAS, the State's strict controls over universities' HR
- 14 policies and pay plans make it impossible for the University to
- 15 compete for talented professors, administrators and staff in a
- 16 global marketplace; and

- 17 WHEREAS, current regulations on construction projects
- 18 increase the costs of construction to the University and delay
- 19 the project's completion; and
- 20 WHEREAS, the UW System is currently prohibited from
- 21 managing its long-term investments and from retaining interest
- 22 gained on those investments; and
- WHEREAS, these investments would allow for the creation of
- 24 endowments for increased financial aid, new academic and support
- 25 structures or financial flexibility; and
- 26 WHEREAS, the UW System is prohibited from independent
- 27 procurement and must instead purchase through the Department of
- 28 Administration although less expensive and local options exist;
- 29 and
- 30 WHEREAS, the ability for individual Universities to set
- 31 tuition is a crucial flexibility for University operations; and
- 32 WHEREAS, the UW System currently maintains a strong
- 33 partnership with students and a history of student input on
- 34 tuition increases; and
- 35 WHEREAS, UW-Eau Claire's Blugold Commitment Differential
- 36 Tuition policy involves substantial student control and has a
- 37 strong track record of success; and
- 38 WHEREAS, the students of UW-Eau Claire recognize the
- 39 concerns facing the UW System; and

- WHEREAS, this proposal would keep UW-Madison inside of the
- 41 UW System, but provide the flexibilities it is seeking through
- 42 the New Badger Partnership; and
- WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Idea Partnership proposal would
- 44 address the aforementioned issues facing the UW System;
- BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Student Senate, on behalf
- 46 of the over 11,000 students of UW-Eau Claire, supports the
- 47 proposed Wisconsin Idea Partnership; and
- 48 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Student Senate renews its
- 49 opposition in the proposal of splitting UW-Madison from the UW
- 50 System; and
- 51 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Student Senate suggests
- 52 that the Wisconsin Idea Partnership should include student
- 53 approval for raises in tuition above levels for cost to continue
- 54 current operations, including cuts from the State; and
- 55 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that established differential
- 56 tuition programs should remain intact and not be rolled into the
- 57 new tuition setting authorities; and
- 58 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Student Senate suggests UW
- 59 System should adapt its proposal to ensure student approval of
- 60 tuition increases above cost to continue levels; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Student Senate suggests
- 62 that the State Legislature should approve the Wisconsin Idea
- Partnership amendment to the 2011-2013 state budget; and
