

# UW System Undergraduate Transfer Student Enrollments\* 2001-02 to 2010-11



<sup>\*</sup>Transfer student enrollments are annual unduplicated headcounts at a UW institution and may differ from the numbers in previous reports.

### **Highlights**

### **Undergraduate Transfer Student Enrollment in 2010-11**

- 17,209 students transferred into or within the UW System in 2010-11.
- Of these transfer students, 15,054 (87%) were new transfer students and 2,155 (13%) were re-entry transfer students.
- UW-Milwaukee received the most new transfer students (2,532), followed by UW-Madison (1,715), UW Colleges (1,514) and UW-Oshkosh (1,468).
- 37% of new transfer students were intra-UW System transfers, 28% were from out-of-state institutions, 25% from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges, 7% from Wisconsin private institutions, and the remainder (3%) from international institutions.

### **Undergraduate New Transfer Student Demographics in Fall 2010**

- 25% of new transfer students entered as freshmen, 38% as sophomores, and 37% as upperclassmen.
- 85% of new transfer students were full-time students.
- 54% of new transfer students were between the ages of 20 and 24.
- 52% of new transfer students were female.
- 12% of new transfer students were students of color.
- 50% of new transfer students were first generation college students.

### **Undergraduate New Transfer Student Outcomes**

- The first year GPA for fall 2010 new transfer students was 3.0.
- The overall second year retention rate for fall 2009 new transfer students was 74%.
- The overall six-year graduation rate for fall 2004 new transfer students was 60%.

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During the 2010-11 academic year, 17,209 students transferred credits from another institution of higher education into or within the UW System. Of these transfer students, 15,054 (87%) were new transfer students and 2,155 (13%) were re-entry transfer students. New transfer students are students who have not previously enrolled at the institution to which they transferred. Re-entry transfer students are students re-enrolling at a UW institution with transfer credits. Over the last ten years, new transfer student enrollment in 2010-11 was the highest, while re-entry transfer student enrollment in 2008-09 was the highest (Figure 1).


Students transfer within the UW System or from the Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS), Wisconsin private colleges and universities, out-of-state colleges and universities, and international colleges and universities. Appendices A and B show the details on new and re-entry transfer students by sending institution (the last college or university from which the student transferred) and receiving institution (the UW institution to which they transferred) from 2006-07 to 2010-11, respectively. Appendices C and D show the details on new and re-entry transfer students by sending institution and receiving institution in 2010-11.

2001-02 to 2010-11




The majority (87%) of transfer students were new transfer students. The remainder of this report focuses on new transfer students only. Figure 2 shows the number of new transfer students to the UW System by type of sending institution from 2006-07 to 2010-11. Compared to 2006-07, all types of sending institutions, with the exception of UW 4-Year institutions, increased their new transfer student enrollments in 2010-11.

Compared to 2006-07, the increase in new transfer students in 2010-11 reflects the increase in new transfer student applications and admissions (Figure 3). Of the 24,243 new transfer student completed applications in 2010-11, 21,260 were admitted by UW institutions (an 88% admission rate). Of those admitted in 2010-11, 15,054 enrolled in UW institutions (a 71% enrollment rate).

New undergraduate degree-seeking students enter as new freshmen or new transfers. In 2010-11, 32 percent of new undergraduate degree-seeking students in the UW System entered as new transfers. Figure 4 shows the number of new transfer students and new transfer students as a percent of new undergraduate degree-seeking students by the UW receiving institution in 2010-11.

UW-Milwaukee received the most new transfer students (2,532), followed by UW-Madison (1,715), UW Colleges (1,514), and UW-Oshkosh (1,468). New transfer students, as a percent of new undergraduate degree-seeking students in 2010-11, ranged from 22 percent at UW-Madison to 58 percent at UW-Superior.

Undergraduate New Transfer Students to the UW System by Receiving Institution 2010-11





Figure 5 illustrates the proportion of new transfer students into or within the UW System in 2010-11 by type of sending institution. Intra-UW System transfers (37%) were the largest source of new transfer students for UW institutions, including transfers among UW 4-Year institutions (17.8%), from UW Colleges to UW 4-Year institutions (15.7%), and from UW 4-Year institutions to UW Colleges (3.5%). The second largest share of new transfers into the UW System, 28 percent, came from out-of-state institutions. New transfer students from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges constituted 25 percent of the total new transfer population. Seven percent (7%) of students transferred from Wisconsin private institutions, while a small percentage (3%) of students transferred from international institutions.


More than half of the students transferring from out-of-state institutions were Wisconsin residents (51% in 2010-11 or 2,174). Of these Wisconsin residents, 31 percent transferred from colleges or universities in Minnesota, 13 percent transferred from colleges or universities in Illinois, and 7 percent transferred from colleges or universities in Iowa. Originating out-of-state institutions sending the most Wisconsin resident transfer students to the UW System in 2010-11 were the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities (206), Winona State University in Minnesota (95), and the University of Phoenix (50). Of the 407 new transfer students from international institutions in 2010-11, 55 (14%) were Wisconsin residents.

From 2006-07 to 2010-11, the percentage of new transfer students to the UW System from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges increased (from 21% to 25%), while the percentage of new transfer students from UW 4-Year institutions decreased (from 25% to 21%). The percentages of new transfer students from other sources remained relatively steady (Figure 6).

About two-thirds of new transfer students begin in the fall term while the remaining third begin in other terms. This section focuses on new transfer students who entered in the fall semester of academic year 2010-11 and the characteristics of these students during the semester that they transferred.

Figure 7 shows the distribution of fall 2010 new transfer cohort by student classification. Student classification is based on the total number of credits transferred from one or more transfer institutions. Overall, 75 percent of new transfers entered as sophomores (38%) or upperclassmen (37%) in fall 2010. The percentage of new transfers entering as sophomores or upperclassmen varied by source with a high of 88% from UW Colleges.

In comparison, the majority (96%) of fall 2010 new freshmen in the UW System entered at the freshman level.

Appendix E provides details on the distribution of fall 2010 new transfer cohort to the UW System by sending institution and student classification. Appendix F shows the percentages of new transfer cohort to the UW System by type of sending institution and student classification from fall 2006 to fall 2010. The proportion of new transfer students entering the UW System as freshmen from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges has significantly decreased, from 48 percent in fall 2006 to 40 percent in fall 2010.

The majority of new transfers (85%) were full-time students, with a credit load of 12 or more credits (Figure 8). The proportion ranged from 74 percent for students transferring from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges to 92 percent for students transferring from international institutions. Appendix G provides details on fall 2010 new transfer students by sending institution and full-time/part-time status.

In comparison, 97 percent of fall 2010 new freshmen in the UW System were enrolled full-time.



Figure 9 shows the age distribution of fall 2010 new transfer cohort. Twenty-four percent (24%) of new transfers were under 20 years old, 54 percent were between ages 20 and 24, and 22 percent were 25 or older. The proportion of new transfers who were 25 or older ranged from 11 percent for those from UW 4-Year institutions to 39 percent for those from the WTCS.

In comparison, 95 percent of fall 2010 new freshmen in the UW System were under 20 years old, 3 percent were 20-24 years old, and 2 percent were 25 years old and over.




Figure 10 Fall 2010 Undergraduate New Transfer Cohort

Overall, 52 percent of the fall 2010 new transfer cohort were female and 48 percent were male (Figure 10). Fortynine percent (49%) of new transfer students from UW Colleges were female, compared to 60 percent from international institutions.

In comparison, 53 percent of fall 2010 new freshmen in the UW System were female.


In the fall 2010 new transfer cohort, 12 percent of the students were students of color (Figure 11). Sixteen percent (16%) of new transfer students from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges and Wisconsin private institutions were students of color, compared to 8 percent from UW Colleges. Of the 1,226 new transfer students of color in fall 2010, 362 (30%) were Hispanic/Latino(a) and 297 (24%) were African American. Refer to Appendix H for details on the distribution of fall 2010 new transfer cohort to the UW System by sending institution and race/ethnicity.

In comparison, 13 percent of fall 2010 new freshmen in the UW System were students of color.

With the addition of two new race/ethnicity categories - "two or more race/ethnicities" and "Hawaiian/Pacific Islander" in fall 2008, caution should be taken when comparing with the previous years' numbers for student of color, in particular for a specific race/ethnicity category. The decrease in new transfer students for a specific race/ethnicity category since fall 2008 may have been affected by the addition of the two new categories. See Appendix I for details.

by Type of Sending Institution and Race/Ethnicity Group



Overall, 50 percent of fall 2010 new transfer students were first generation college students (Figure 12). New transfer students from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges (60%) and UW Colleges (59%) were more likely to be first generation college students.

In comparison, 43 percent of fall 2010 new freshmen in the UW System were first generation college students.

### **Grade Point Average**

Figure 13 shows the first year grade point averages (GPA) for fall 2008, 2009, and 2010 new transfer students. This GPA reflects the courses that the new transfer students completed during their first year after transfer. The average first year GPA of fall 2010 new transfer students was 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. There has been little change in the average first year GPA for the past three cohorts of fall new transfer entrants. Appendix J details the average first year GPAs of the fall 2008, 2009, and 2010 new transfer cohort to the UW System by sending institution.

In comparison, the average first year GPA of fall 2010 new freshmen in the UW System was 2.9.


Average First Year GPAs of New Transfer Cohort to the UW System

### **Second Year Retention Rate**

Another measure of success for new students is second year retention rate; that is, the percentage of students who successfully complete their first year and return to the same institution for a second year of study. Of the new transfer students who entered in fall 2009, 74 percent returned in fall 2010. Figure 14 shows that the first to second year retention rates for fall 2007, 2008, and 2009 new transfer students varied by type of sending institution. Fall 2009 new transfer students from UW Colleges had the highest second year retention rate (82%), while those from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges had the lowest second year retention rate (69%). Appendix K provides details on the second year retention rates for the fall 2009 new transfer cohort to the UW System by sending institution and full-time/part-time status. Appendix L shows the second year retention rates for the fall 2009 new transfer cohort by type of sending institution and receiving institution.



New transfers entering as full-time students persisted at a much higher rate (76%) than those entering as part-time students (60%) (Figure 15). For new transfers entering as full-time students in fall 2009, the second year retention rates ranged from 83 percent for students transferring from UW Colleges to 72 percent for students transferring from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges.

In comparison, the second year retention rate for new freshmen who entered the UW System in fall 2009 as full-time students was 81 percent.

New transfers who entered as sophomores or upperclassmen were retained at a higher rate than those who entered as freshmen (Figure 16). Overall, students who transferred as sophomores or upperclassmen in fall 2009 had a second year retention rate of 77 percent and 78 percent, respectively; while students who transferred at the freshman level had a 61 percent second year retention rate. However, these rates varied by type of sending institution. For example, the second year retention rates ranged from 81 percent for sophomore transfers from UW 4-year institutions to 74 percent for sophomore transfers from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges.





Figure 17 shows the second year retention rates of fall 2009 new transfer cohort by the UW receiving institution. Overall, the second year retention rate was 74 percent. The second year retention rates varied by the UW receiving institution, ranging from 90 percent for new transfer cohort at UW-Madison to 62 percent for new transfer cohort at UW-Parkside. Appendix M provides details on the second year retention rates for the fall 2009 new transfer cohort by receiving institution and student classification.



### Six-Year Graduation Rate

Six-year graduation rates also provide a measure of success for transfer students. Figure 18 shows six-year graduation rates at any UW institution for fall 2002, 2003, and 2004 new transfers by type of sending institution. Overall, the six-year graduation rate in the UW System was around 60 percent. Fall 2004 new transfers from UW Colleges had the highest six-year graduation rate (71%), followed by fall 2004 new transfers from UW 4-Year institutions (67%). A lower six-year graduation rate (46% for the fall 2004 new transfer cohort) for students transferring from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges may be affected by a higher proportion of non-traditional and part-time transfer students who may take longer to graduate. Six percent (6%) of the fall 2004 new transfers from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges were still enrolled in the 7<sup>th</sup> year, while overall, 4 percent of the fall 2004 new transfers were enrolled in the 7<sup>th</sup> year. Appendix N shows six-year graduation rates for the fall 2004 new transfer cohort to the UW System by sending institution and full-time/part-time status. Appendix O shows six-year graduation rates for the fall 2004 new transfer cohort by type of sending institution and receiving institution.



Six-year graduation rates for the new transfer cohort entering as full-time students were much higher than for those entering as part-time students (Figure 19). Overall, 64 percent of new transfer students entering as full-time students in fall 2004 graduated within six years, compared to 37 percent for part-time new transfer students. The six-year graduation rates varied by type of sending institution, ranging from 73 percent for new transfers from UW Colleges entering as full-time students in fall 2004 to 51 percent for new transfers from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges entering as full-time students in fall 2004.

In comparison, the UW System six-year graduation rate for new freshmen who entered as full-time students in fall 2004 was 67 percent.

Students who transferred as sophomores or upperclassmen had higher six-year graduation rates than students who transferred as freshmen. Within the same student level, these rates varied by type of sending institution. For example, six-year graduation rates ranged from 72 percent for fall 2004 new sophomore transfers from UW 4-Year institutions to 55 percent for fall 2004 new sophomore transfers from the Wisconsin Technical Colleges (Figure 20).

Fall 2004





Figure 21 shows the six-year graduation rates of fall 2004 new transfer cohort by the UW receiving institution. Overall, the six-year graduation rate in the UW System was 60 percent. The six-year graduation rates varied by the UW receiving institution, ranging from 83 percent for the new transfer cohort at UW-Madison to 45 percent for the new transfer cohort at UW-Parkside. Appendix P shows six-year graduation rates for the fall 2004 new transfer cohort by receiving institution and student classification.
