
WHEG Recommendation for 2013-15 Biennium

Background

- Wisconsin Higher Education Grant (WHEG) program is administered by the Higher Education Aids Board (HEAB)
- HEAB must submit its request for the 2013-15 biennium in September. HEAB approves its request in early August.
- UW provides its formal recommendations for WHEG funding, based on forecasted need
- To be eligible, family must have EFC of \$4,000 or less
 - Maximum award: \$2,384 (2012-13)
 - Minimum: \$784 (2012-13)
 - Average: \$1,962 (2010-11)




Funding has been flat





Unmet need is growing






Recommendation for 2013-15

- Using past average of past four years for planning purposes, recommend 5.5% increase in each year of the biennium, per the statutory link
- In addition, recommend 5.5% "catch-up" funding for each year of the 2011-13 biennium
- \$68.5 million for 2013-14 and \$72.2 million for 2014-15
- Biennial budget impact: \$24.1 million

Recommendation for 2013-15

- Recommended funding would provide for 4,000 to 6,000 additional WHEG awards
- Fulfills the commitment that WHEG appropriation keeps pace with tuition
- More eligible students receive aid
- Shorter waiting lists
- Even at these levels, unmet need will remain
