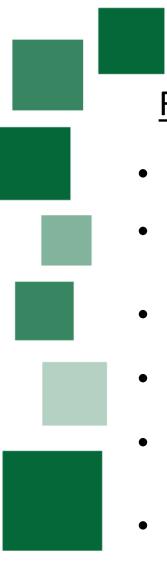
# Student Profile: Freshmen vs. Total Undergraduates

#### <u>Freshmen</u>

- 37% Pell recipients
- 56% first generation
- 10% part time
- 41% residential
- 57% work more than 16 hours per week
- 31% work more than
  21 hours per week

#### All Undergraduates

- 41% Pell recipients
- 54% first generation
- 26% part time
- 19% residential
- 64% work more than 16 hours per week
- 51% work more than 21 hours per week



# **Incoming Class of 2013**

### Freshmen (N=704)

- 54.6% Female
- 23.8% Under-Represented Minority (URM)
- 27.6% Out of Area
- 12 Nontraditional (1.6%)
- 13 International Students (1.8%)
- Average ACT: 21.11 (increased by a full point)

- 53.7% Female

- 3.4% International Students

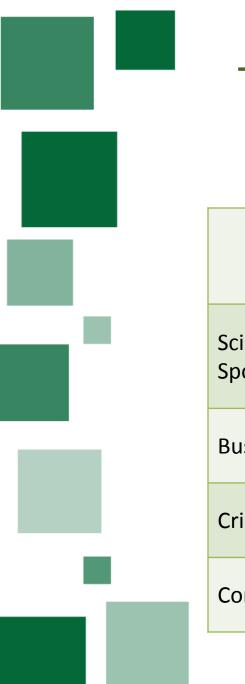

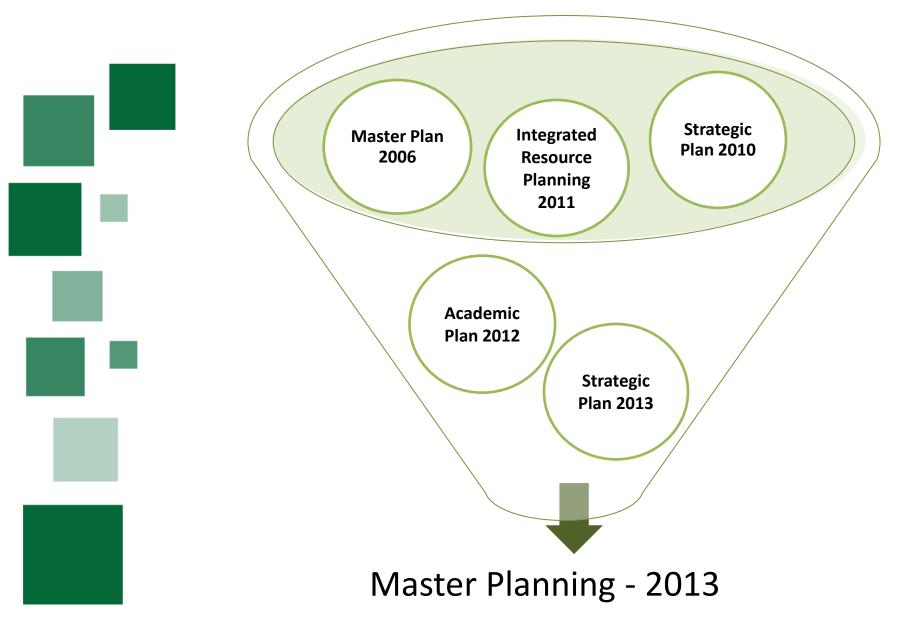
