

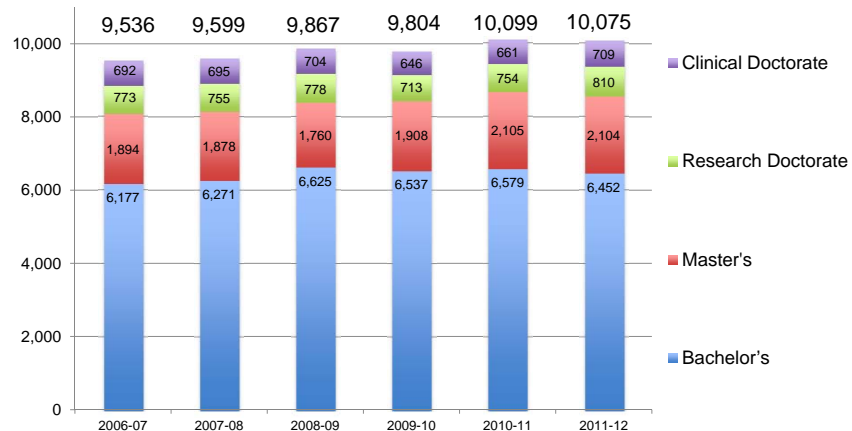

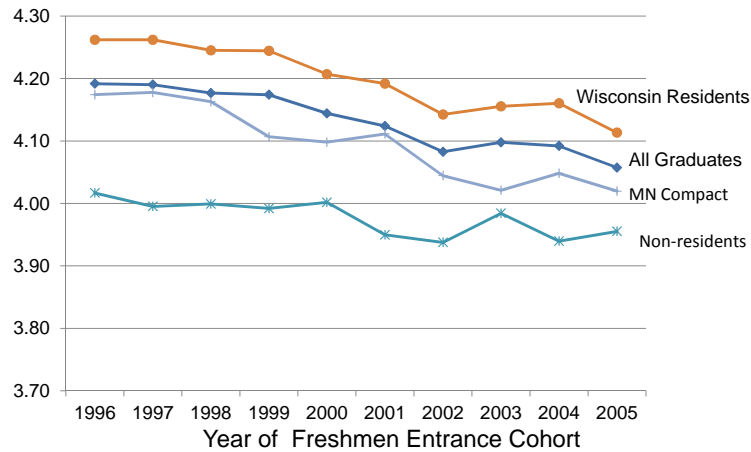


Productivity - Degrees Conferred



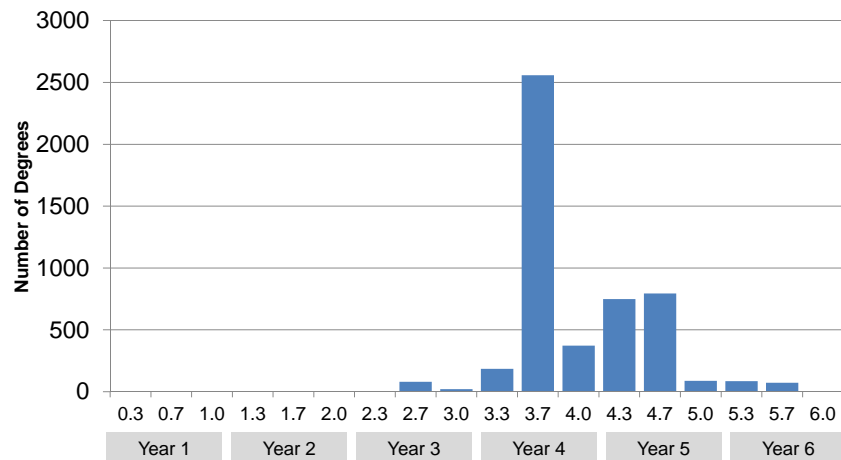
Time to Degree

Elapsed Calendar Years to Graduation for New Freshmen



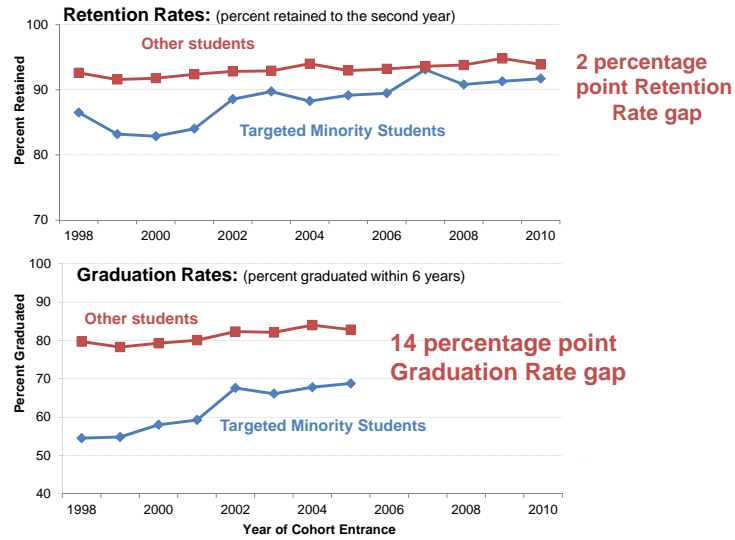
Average time to degree has decreased from 4.19 to 4.06 elapsed calendar years over the past decade.

Average Time to Degree for New Freshmen

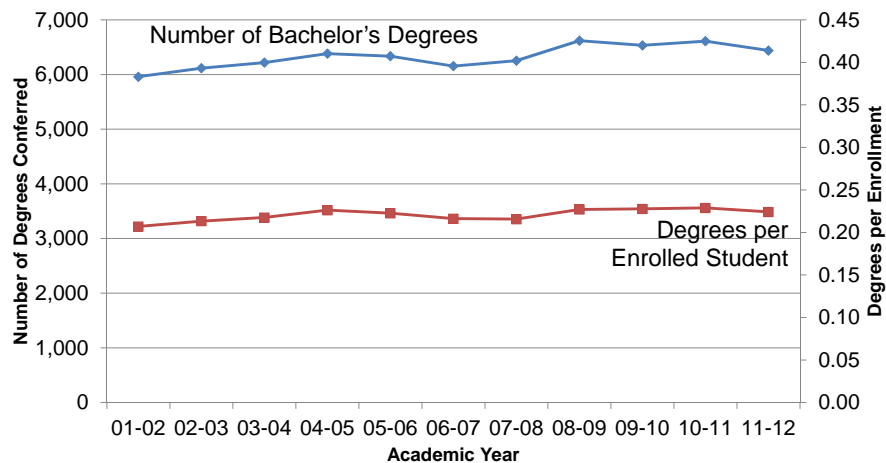


The most common time to degree (mode) is four academic years.

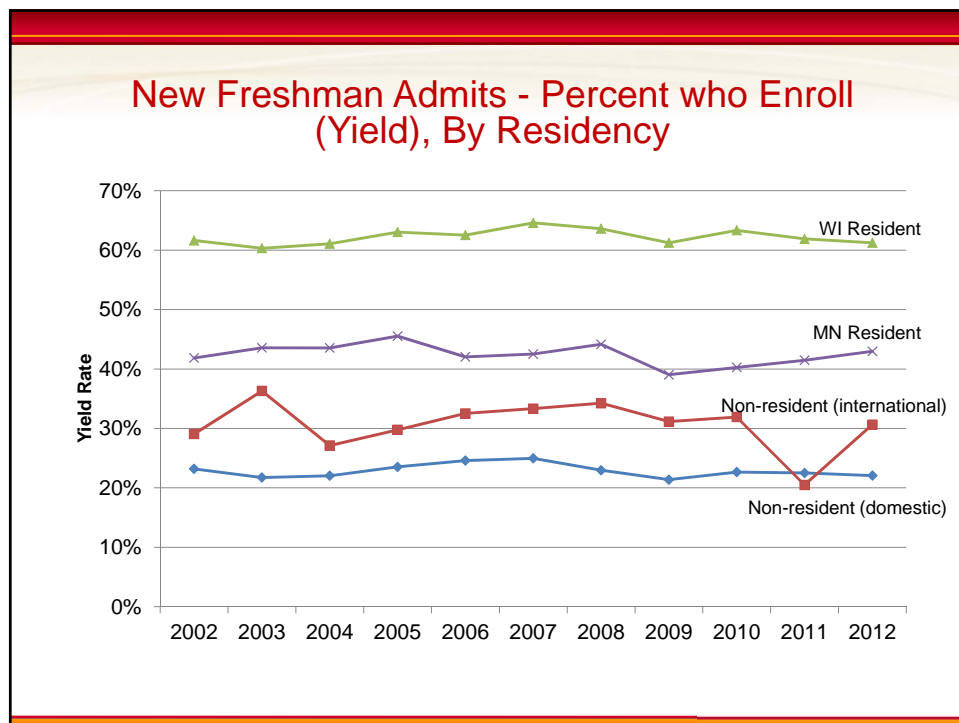
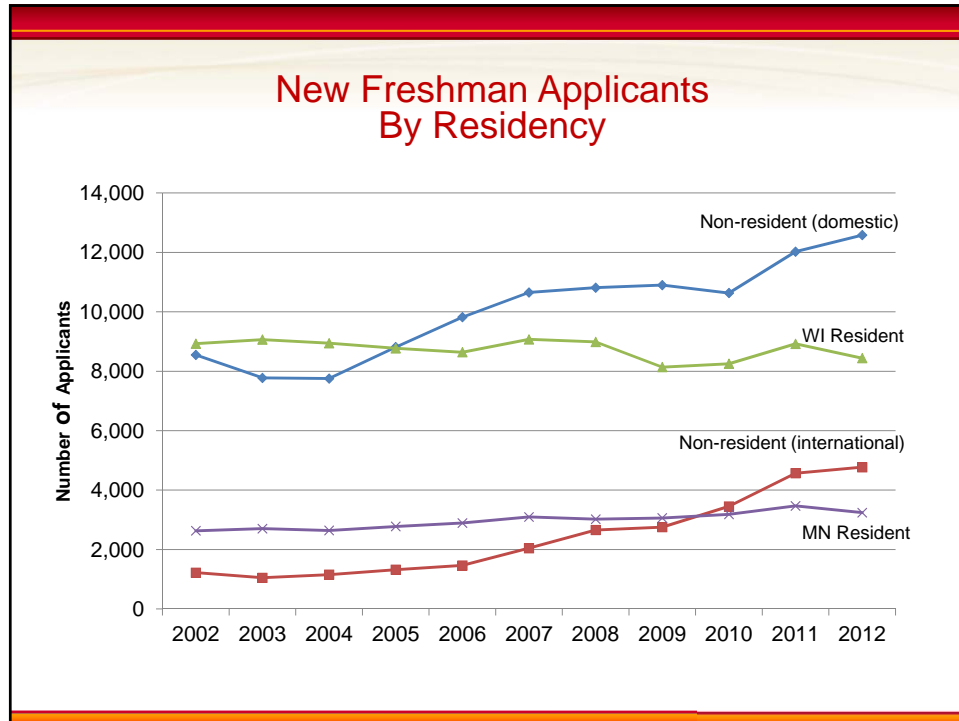
Retention and Graduation Rate Gaps between Targeted Minority and Non-Targeted Students



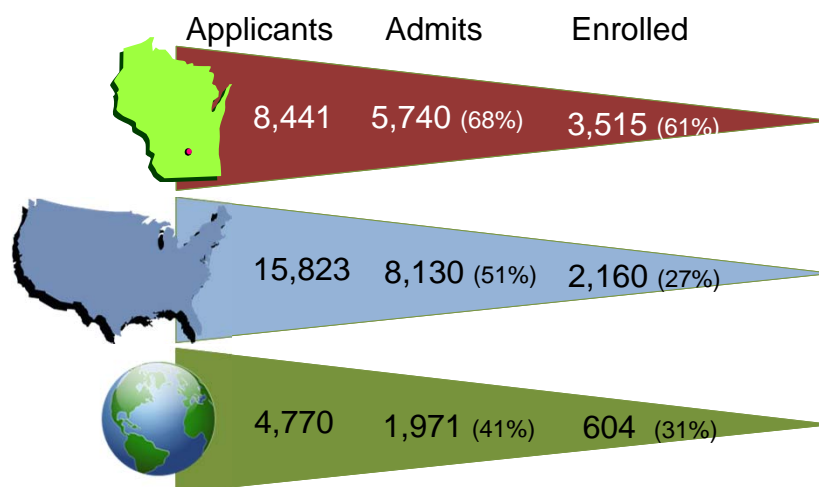
Bachelors Degrees and Degrees per Undergraduate Enrolled
