Profile of Brenda Cullin

Academic Department Associate/Office Manager, Department of Economics University of Wisconsin–Milwaukee 2021 Regents University Staff Excellence Award Individual Recipient

Highlights from nomination materials:

- Has served UW-Milwaukee (UWM) for 42 years, as business manager for the Institute for Survey and Policy Research and as office manager (academic department associate) for the Department of Economics since 2011.
- Service and contributions have enhanced the sense of community and equity in the Department of Economics and more broadly at UWM; department cost-saving measures she suggested were adopted and the savings supported faculty and graduate-level research, improving department morale.
- Initiated a Graduate Student Lounge in 2019 to provide a space for undergraduate and graduate economics students to study and get to know one another.
- Inaugural chair of the University Staff Grievance Committee, example of her commitment to ensuring that university staff receive appropriate and fair governance; completed additional leadership training for the role.
- Has served on executive-level search-and-screen committees and Chancellor's Best Place to Work Coordinating Team; treasurer for her local union.
- Co-chair of the African Diaspora Council (ADC), an employee resource group she was integral in helping to revive composed of university faculty and staff; ADC's award-winning work has been highlighted in campus and community publications; through her leadership, the ADC continues to meet its goals of promoting and enhancing a sense of community, equity, and professional development for faculty, staff, and students.
- Instrumental in establishing ADC's scholarship program by establishing campus, community, and corporate partnerships to assist UWM students and graduate more African American students, bridging equity gaps; over the last four years, ADC awarded \$38,000 to 21 scholars; to date, 19 of the students have graduated UWM.
- Spearheaded ADC's fundraising that provides two Milwaukee Public Schools with school supplies, offering muchneeded support that became even more important during the pandemic.

In Brenda Cullin's own words:

• "Priority first is my students! I make sure they have all the necessary tools to succeed in their studies, as well as a work-life balance....In my 40+ years on campus, I have always seen myself as the 'go-to' person for advice and counsel around issues on campus that impact the department, the university staff, and African American employees. I often say I am the voice for the voiceless and speak on the mission and vision of the university around issues of diversity and inclusion."
