INSTITUTION: University of Wisconsin-Green Bay

REQUEST: Authority to execute a ground lease and allow Brown County to construct a

63,000 square foot building on 7.9 acres of land on the UW-Green Bay campus. The President shall not execute said ground lease until the Board of Regents has approved the lease terms on behalf of UW-Green Bay.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

This project will construct a three-story, multi-tenant, office and laboratory building on the campus of UW-Green Bay. Brown County will use a \$5.0 million, non-state grant to partially fund the construction of an office, lab, and warehouse building of approximately 63,000 square feet, in part to accommodate the new mechanical engineering program. The building will be referred to as the Brown County STEM Innovation Center.

PROJECT JUSTIFICATION:

The Brown County STEM Innovation Center will serve as a focal point for the region's growth plans by providing engineering training to meet the needs of the area's manufacturing sector.

The office, lab, and warehouse building will accommodate various tenants such as: the Einstein Project, a private non-profit organization dedicated to the development and distribution of STEM education materials; UW-Extension Agriculture and Horticulture programs; and Brown County Land and Water Conservation offices, in addition to the university's mechanical engineering program.

As required by the terms of the non-state grant, as enumerated in 2017 Wisconsin Act 59, and as stated in Section 13.48(33s), Wis. Stats., the balance of the projected \$15.0 million total project cost will come from non-state revenue sources. The fundraising goal is expected to be met as of July 1, 2018.

A lease for the office and lab space between Brown County and the UW System Board of Regents will be presented to the Board once the final building design has been completed. The ground lease will not be executed until the office lease is approved by the Board. The building will be operated and managed by Brown County.

The ground lease will have an initial term of 20 years and will include two 20-year renewal options. The ground lease includes protections for UW-Green Bay such as if Brown County chooses to vacate the building prior to the term expiration, the building will be surrendered to

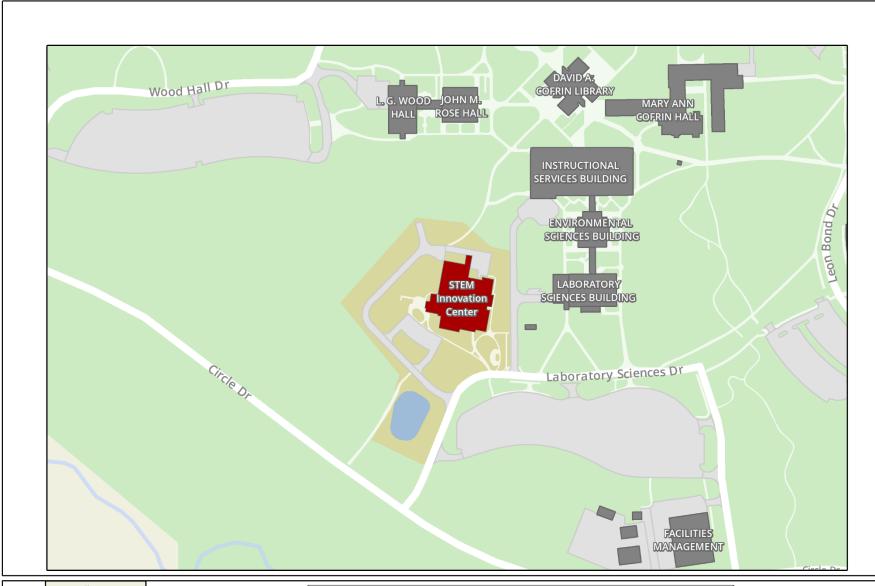
UW-Green Bay at a purchase price based on a formula including the initial construction cost, the expected life of the building, and the number of years the building has been in service. Other protections include the provisions that the Board of Regents has right-of-first-refusal to purchase the building, and Brown County cannot lease to any other tenant that would conflict with the university's mission as a public university.

The UW System Administration Office of General Counsel has reviewed and agreed with the terms and conditions of the ground lease.

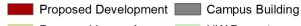


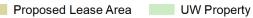

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The Northwest Quadrant (NWQ) Renovation project, the former Columbia/St. Mary's hospital complex, will address critical life safety and building code upgrades. Newly renovated space will serve as office and support space for various academic departments and provide space for the College of Health Sciences and the College of Nursing. The scope includes the addition and upgrade of automatic fire sprinklers and fire protection systems; fire separation; egress lighting; elevator modifications; associated architectural, mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems (MEP); asbestos abatement; and accessibility improvements. Project work will be completed in phases to allow the relocation of occupants.

The NWQ is comprised of seven facilities (named buildings A through G). Exterior envelope repairs for Buildings C and D will be performed to restore the integrity and improve energy efficiency. Buildings C and D will receive minor mechanical, electrical, and plumbing modifications to accommodate the proposed uses and achieve an additional 20 to 30 years of useful life. The work for the College of Health Sciences and the College of Nursing includes remodeling space in Building C and/or D to create new academic space and instructional laboratories.

PROJECT JUSTIFICATION:

This project is needed to address critical life safety and building code upgrades. Critical life safety changes are required to bring the buildings, which were constructed between 1919 and 1993, into compliance with building codes and the appropriate business occupancy. The most significant issue to be corrected is the lack of a fully automatic fire sprinkler system throughout the complex. Fire separations, egress lighting, and elevators also need to be updated. The MEP and fire protection systems are past their useful lives, energy inefficient, and in need of replacement in buildings A and B. The building envelopes of buildings A, B, and now D require repairs that include replacement of failing windows. Infrastructure systems in buildings C and D are more recent and in better condition, but require modest renovations to the mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems to extend their usability for the next 20 to 30 years. Basic infrastructure work is required before functional renovations can be completed.

In the fall of 2016, the exterior envelope of Building D showed signs of imminent failure. A small project was undertaken by DOA/DFDM to stabilize the envelope and investigate solutions. It was determined that the NWQ project was the best alternative to replace the envelope in its entirety.

Supported Borrowing.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

This project renovates and updates 24,148 ASF/37,979 GSF of May Hall and constructs a 1,906 ASF/2,540 GSF addition to address accessibility deficits. The work will improve residence hall amenity spaces, as well as correct current maintenance and infrastructure deficiencies.

This project will construct an Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) accessible entrance and lobby on the west side of the building and provide a 5-stop, dual door elevator for accessibility to all floors. The existing lobby on the east end of the building will be remodeled into student study space. Areas of the building that the project will update include the resident director's apartment, basement restrooms, a basement kitchen, and student recreation space. Infrastructure will be upgraded throughout the building. The steam heating system and the main electrical distribution system will be replaced and a new fire suppression system will be installed.

The building envelope will be tuck-pointed to repair deterioration of the building envelope. Selective finishes and fixtures in corridors and bathrooms that were not recently improved during previous renovations will be updated. Exposed conduits in common corridors will be covered, obsolete fire hose cabinets will be removed, and outdated signage will be updated. Restroom upgrades include new hand dryers, and ceilings that are patched, repaired, and re-painted. Upgrades to resident rooms include new finishes, fixtures, and lighting. The entire building will be off-line for one semester to minimize the time required for the project's construction. There is available swing space on the campus to house the displaced residents.

PROJECT JUSTIFICATION:

The roof and windows were replaced within the past ten years, but the soft broken mortar of the exterior masonry still requires repair. The fire alarm systems have received periodic upgrades, but the building is not protected by sprinklers. Although not required, fire sprinklers are considered a standard life safety feature in new residence hall construction and should be added to existing residence halls when possible. The resident rooms and common areas have not been remodeled since original construction, with the exception of the installation of ethernet and cable television connections. Floor restrooms were recently remodeled, although electric hand dryers were not installed at that time.

May Hall is physically connected to the east end of the Emogene Nelson Center, which will be demolished as part of the Falcon Center for Health, Education, and Wellness project in June 2019. The demolition of this attached building will leave the west facade of May Hall exposed to the elements and the process of enclosing the exposed structure presents an opportunity to bring the building into compliance with current accessibility standards. A new near street level entrance will provide basic ADA compliant access into the building mid-way between the basement and first floor levels. The building is not presently accessible, but full accessibility to all areas of the building would be easily accomplished with the addition of a two-door, multistop elevator.

During the preliminary design of May Hall Renovation project, the design team discovered that additional square footage was needed at the elevator lobby on each floor to accommodate ADA requirements. This expands the footprint of the building and increases the budget significantly.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

This project will construct a new 16,267 GSF Visitor Center and Admissions Building. The two story facility will house the Office of Admissions, as well as UW-Eau Claire Alumni Association and UW-Eau Claire Foundation operations.

The new building will have a reception desk and gathering space on the first floor, so admissions staff can greet visiting groups before departing onto the campus mall for tours. A handful of private offices will allow the staff to privately meet with prospective students and their families regarding academic and financial counseling.

The second floor will provide conference rooms, offices, workstations and support areas to house alumni and foundation operations.

PROJECT JUSTIFICATION:

Each year the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire welcomes more than 17,000 prospective students, parents, and others for campus visits. In addition, the University has nearly 85,000 alumni throughout the United States and around the world. Currently all campus visitors are welcomed at the parking kiosk, which is located in a small parking lot across from Schneider Hall. The structure can hold only 5 or 6 people along with one attendant manning the desk.

The university has received a generous \$5.5 million dollar gift to construct a new Visitor Center and Admissions building on an empty site along Roosevelt Avenue at the entrance to the campus mall.

The new building will provide space for the two entities most engaged with interested external populations: admissions and alumni/development. Co-locating these groups will promote connections between alumni and prospective students, and will facilitate alumni participation in the student outreach and recruitment process.

SUMMARY AND BACKGROUND:

This request is presented in accordance with University of Wisconsin System Board of Regents Policy 19-14 which requires that the naming of facilities, buildings or land controlled by the Board be submitted for approval. The Chancellor has requested this action.

The University would like to rename UW-Barron County to reflect the integration of the institution with its new strategic partner. UW-Eau Claire is implementing a multi-pronged outreach and recruitment plan with the intention of expanding enrollment and building greater awareness in the region.

UW-Eau Claire and UW-Barron County are planning various summer events designed to drive enrollment for the 2018-19 academic year. Approval of the name change will allow UW-Eau Claire to produce branded materials and officially launch the new name in a timely manner for 2018-19 recruitment efforts. This action will be subject to the Higher Learning Commission's (HLC) approval of the Restructuring Plan.

UW-Eau Claire in concert with UW-Barron County have held listening sessions with community members and governmental colleagues to discuss educational programming, regional economic development needs, and naming and branding of the new partnership. Support for this action and a description of the process are attached.

A resolution of support for the new name by the Barron County Board of Supervisors was unanimously approved May 21, 2018.

Following is an outline of the steps taken to assure stakeholder engagement:

Nov. 30, 2017

A Communications and External Relations task force was formed to lead the communication efforts, including branding and renaming of the two-year campus. Members were drawn from both the UW-Eau Claire and UW Barron County campuses. Members included: UW-Barron County: Wufeng Tian, Suzanne Truman, Elizabeth Schmidt, Joel Friederich, Brian Becker, Barb Ritzinger; UW-Eau Claire: Darrell Newton, Jean Piper, Rebecca Dienger, Amanda Thao (Student), Heather Kretz, Billy Felz, Linda Young, Kim Way, Mike Rindo

Dec. 8, 2017

UW-Eau Claire Integrated Marketing and Communications staff met with UW-Barron County Campus Administrator Brittany Nielsen to get more information about the needs of UWBC, prospective students and community. Stakeholders were identified and a process outlined.

March 1, 2018 – Listening Sessions

Representatives of the Task Force held a listening session at UW-Barron County with the **Rice** Lake Chamber of Commerce Education & Economic Development Committee to discuss the restructuring, current and future UW-Barron County educational programming possibilities, regional economic development needs and naming and branding –15 participants present

A second listening session was held at the Barron County Government Center, attended by members of the public, several **Barron County Board Supervisors**, **Barron County employees** and **State Representative Romaine Quinn** – 20 participants present



University of Wisconsin - Eau Claire

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March 12, 2018

Task Force representatives held separate, concurrent listening sessions with **faculty, staff and students** at UW-Barron County to discuss the restructuring, current and future UW-Barron County educational programming possibilities, regional economic development needs and naming and branding – 13 present at faculty/staff meeting, 10 present at student meeting

March 20, 2018

A survey about potential new names for UW-Barron County was sent to campus and community constituents including:

- UWBC Faculty & Staff (63)
- UWBC Foundation Directors, Present & Past (approx. 65)
- UWBC Students (approx. 550)
- Barron County Board of Supervisors (29)
- Barron County Dept Supervisors & Managers (40+)
- Rice Lake Rotary (approx. 80)

130 responses were received, with 71 from students.

40 percent of the total votes were for **University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire – Barron County**. Other choices were:

- University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire, Barron County Campus (31.5 percent)
- UW Barron County, a University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire Campus (20 percent); and
- University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire at Barron County (8.5 percent).

March 22, 2018

Task Force representatives held a listening session with the **Rice Lake Noon Rotary Club** (club has a broad representation of local influencers) to discuss the restructuring, current and future UW-Barron County educational programming possibilities, regional economic development needs and naming and branding – about 45 present

May 2, 2018

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

Facility Maintenance and Repair Requests

<u>WTW - 16L1S - Williams Center Pedestrian Bridge Replacement (\$696,700):</u> This project replaces the pedestrian bridge on the north side of the Williams Center. Project work includes demolition of the emergency fire exit ramp from Gym 1 and construction of a similar replacement structure to provide emergency egress. The concrete bridge will be replaced and all associated pedestrian walkways, site improvements, and landscaping will be reconstructed to meet ADA requirements for entry into the building.

The pedestrian bridge serves as the exit discharge from the Williams Center Gym 1 and spans from the north facade to a large slab on grade walkway. Thirteen code-required doors exit directly from the gymnasium onto the pedestrian bridge and two doors exit through a vestibule, providing approximately 50 linear feet of egress width and capacity for 2,800 occupants. The bridge is constructed of reinforced concrete slab and was previously restored approximately ten to twelve years ago when a urethane membrane was installed over the slab. That membrane has failed and allowed water and deicing materials to deteriorate the concrete and reinforcement in the slab. The underside of the slab has several hairline cracks, rust stains, exposed rebar, peeling paint and spalling of concrete. The corners of the slab, where it rests on the bearing location, have missing chunks and cracked concrete.

PROJECT JUSTIFICATION:

UW System Administration continues to work with each institution to develop a comprehensive campus physical development plan, including infrastructure maintenance planning. After a thorough review and consideration of All Agency Project proposals and infrastructure planning

issues submitted, as well as the UW All Agency Projects Program funding targets set by the Division of Facilities Development, this request represents high priority University of Wisconsin System infrastructure maintenance, repair, renovation, and upgrade needs. This request focuses on existing facilities and utilities, targets the known maintenance needs, and addresses outstanding health and safety issues. Where possible, similar work throughout a single facility or across multiple facilities has been combined into a single request to provide more efficient project management and project execution.

STATUS REPORT ON UW SOLELY MANGAGED CAPITAL PROJECTS DECEMBER 2017 THROUGH MAY 2018

BACKGROUND

Regent Policy Document 13-5, "Capital Projects Solely Managed by the UW System" requires that a summary of extramural gifts, grants, and contracts be reported to the Associate Vice President for Capital Planning and Budget for presentation to the Capital Planning and Budget Committee of the Board of Regents. The attached report is intended to meet that requirement.

The policy further directs that contracts for UW managed projects that exceed \$1,000,000 require formal approval by the Board of Regents prior to 25% design completion. In addition, any contract with a value of less than \$1,000,000 that, in the judgment of the President of the UW System, warrants direct Board approval shall also be approved by the Board prior to execution. Capital contracts covered by these requirements are included in semi-annual reports upon execution and are also presented individually to the Capital Planning and Budget Committee of the Board of Regents.

The policy also requires that contracts with a value less than \$1,000,000 be reviewed by the institution's legal affairs office or the UW System Office of General Counsel, prior to execution.

REQUESTED ACTION

No action is required; this item is for information only.

DISCUSSION

The status report of gift and grant funded projects managed solely by the University of Wisconsin System represents activity from December 1, 2017, through May 31, 2018. Since the inception of the program in July 2015, a total of forty-one projects have commenced, which is an increase of eleven projects since the last report was presented to the Board on December 1, 2017.

The total value of the projects has increased from \$81,087,300 to \$94,037,100. Eleven projects were begun in 2018, of which one is a planning study. Conversations were initiated about seven additional projects to be started in the near future. Architect and Engineering On Call contracts were signed and became instrumental in the successful delivery of quick projects.

A synopsis of the program:

- \$81.5 million active projects
- \$3 million on hold or cancelled projects
- \$2.5 million new projects just commenced

- \$1.5 million studies
- \$80 million design/construction

Most recently, Grainger Hall had a grand opening on May 2nd. This ribbon cutting event occurred just 22 months after the architect selection process began for this \$5 M project.

There are active projects underway at UW-Extension, UW-Madison, UW-Milwaukee, UW-Eau Claire, UW-Parkside, UW-River Falls, and UW-Stevens Point.

REQUEST: Approval to complete the design and construction of the Bascom

Hall Room 165 Remodel project for a total project cost of

\$1,900,000 Gift Funds.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

This project will repurpose Lecture Hall 165 into an office suite. A new entrance into the office suite will be added at the south end of the existing corridor adjacent to the main staircase creating one executive office that is easily identifiable by campus staff and outside visitors. The project will include approximately 2,600 ASF of interior renovations that will respect the historic nature of the building. Room 165 will be repurposed in a way that allows it to be returned to its original function, if deemed necessary in the future. Work will include a complete interior remodeling that includes demolition of the stage and seating, leveling of the sloped floor, and the installation of new interior partitions finishes, HVAC, plumbing, fire protection, and electrical systems within the remodeled area.

PROJECT JUSTIFICATION:

Bascom Hall, which is located at 500 Lincoln Drive on top of Bascom Hill, is one of the oldest and most famous buildings on the UW-Madison campus. Its construction began in 1857 and was completed in 1859, with additions to the building in 1899, 1905, and 1927. Bascom Hall houses many executive and administrative offices including those of the Chancellor, the Vice Chancellor for Finance and Administration, the Provost, the Secretary of the Faculty, the Dean of Students, the Graduate School, University Relations, and Legal Affairs, as well as offices for numerous other departments. Bascom Hall was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1974 as a contributing feature within the Bascom Hill Historic District.

Over the last several years and following the recommendations of recent campus master plans, some areas of Bascom Hall have been gradually converted from academic use to space that supports executive and administrative functions. This project is in keeping with that plan as it will convert under-utilized classroom space to badly needed program space, reorganize the location of the chancellor's executive and administrative staff, and create a more efficient working configuration. It will also improve access and egress for the offices, consolidate the entry sequence, and create an opportunity to reorganize other administrative spaces in the building.
