Help Your Students Succeed in **Just 15 Minutes!**

Progress Reports allow instructors to notify the Retention Team when a student needs



assistance.

Progress Reports are simple, online forms that ask instructors to identify students who need extra academic assistance. Typically, instructors will spend 15 minutes or less submitting Progress Reports for their students. The retention team contacts the students who need assistance to connect them with resources or an academic coach. Utilizing Progress Reports helps ensure that students get the help they need early in the semester when they have the most chance of improving in their class.

During Fall 2018...

209 instructors submitted Progress Reports

807 alerts submitted about 513 students

59% of alerts submitted through Progress Reports

What happens once an instructor indicates a student

needs assistance?

Depending on the severity of a student's situation, an academic coach will either refer a student to helpful resources (Tutoring, the Writing Center, etc.) or invite the student to make an academic coaching appointment.

Of those 513 students who received Progress Reports during Fall 2018...



59% of students met with an academic coach after being invited for coaching. On average, students who met with a coach earned a 1.65 term GPA (roughly a C-) while those who did not earned a 1.34 term GPA (roughly a D+).

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How can I submit a Progress Report for my students?

Watch your email the week of February 11th for a Progress Report Request.

The Progress Report request will include a list of pre-identified students in your courses who may be potentially at-risk. Follow the instructions in the email to respond! More information about Progress Reports is available here.
