Changing policies: UW-Parkside

- Academic standing policy
- Drop deadlines
- Advising registration holds

Addressing barriers to registration: UW-La Crosse

- Increased balance holds
- Reminders before/after registration & easy step to respond



#### Academic Support

Academic Coaching: UW-Platteville

- Help students examine academic concerns or perceived barriers to success
- Positive impact on retention for students attending academic coaching

Students on Probation: UW-Green Bay

- Piloting Academic rebound program for second-year probationary students
- Cleaning up language to be more positive



# Holistic Support

Financial

- Emergency grant programs
- Retention grants/Balance forgiveness programs
- Removal of enrollment deposits
- Basic needs support


YOU@UWM: UW-Milwaukee

#### Interventions & Outreach

- Outreach to students who are not: logging into Canvas, picking up textbooks, using food service, engaged at 6-week mark, etc. . . .
- Navigate: Campaigns, early alerts, progress reports, quick polls, care units...





# Enrollment, Transitions & Advising

Changes to Advising Structure

- UW-Stevens Point: Professional advisors for first 18 months
- UW-Green Bay: Advisors work with students throughout academic career
- UW-Whitewater: Retention predictor intervention model

Systemwide: Re-enrollment campaigns, Re-imagining orientation, Expanding and modifying Bridge programs etc.

- UW-River Falls: Reenrollment Quest
  - Tracking/communication plan to reenroll eligible students in spring involving weekly updates by college

UW-Stout: Weekly "Focus on Retention"


