Important China Updates as of 25 JAN 2023

Below are quick updates about changes to foreign national admissions to China and visa issuance.

- As of Sunday, January 8, 2023 foreign national visitors are no longer required to quarantine upon arrival in China.
- Travelers entering China will need to present a negative PCR (nucleic acid test) taken no earlier than 48-hours prior to departure along with a visa, or, reason for visa-free entry.
- Currently, the government of China is granting visas for Business (M visa), Work Permits (Z visa), Family Visit/Family Reunion visas, Flight Crew, and some student visas. Visas for tourism are not permitted.
- All visas issued prior to March 2020 are currently suspended (including 5-year and 10-year visas with validity remaining).
- As of this writing 22 governments (including Australia, Canada, France, Spain, the United Kingdom, and the United States) are requiring individuals coming from China to provide a negative PCR test to enter their countries.
- While visa issuance and processing times are fluid and changing, the government of China has indicated that it will work with its individual consulates to process visas in an expeditious manner.
- Chinese consular posts in Japan and South Korea suspended issuing visas to citizens of those countries on Tuesday, January 10, 2023.

The changes occurring with regard to China are fluid and more updates will be provided as events warrant.


