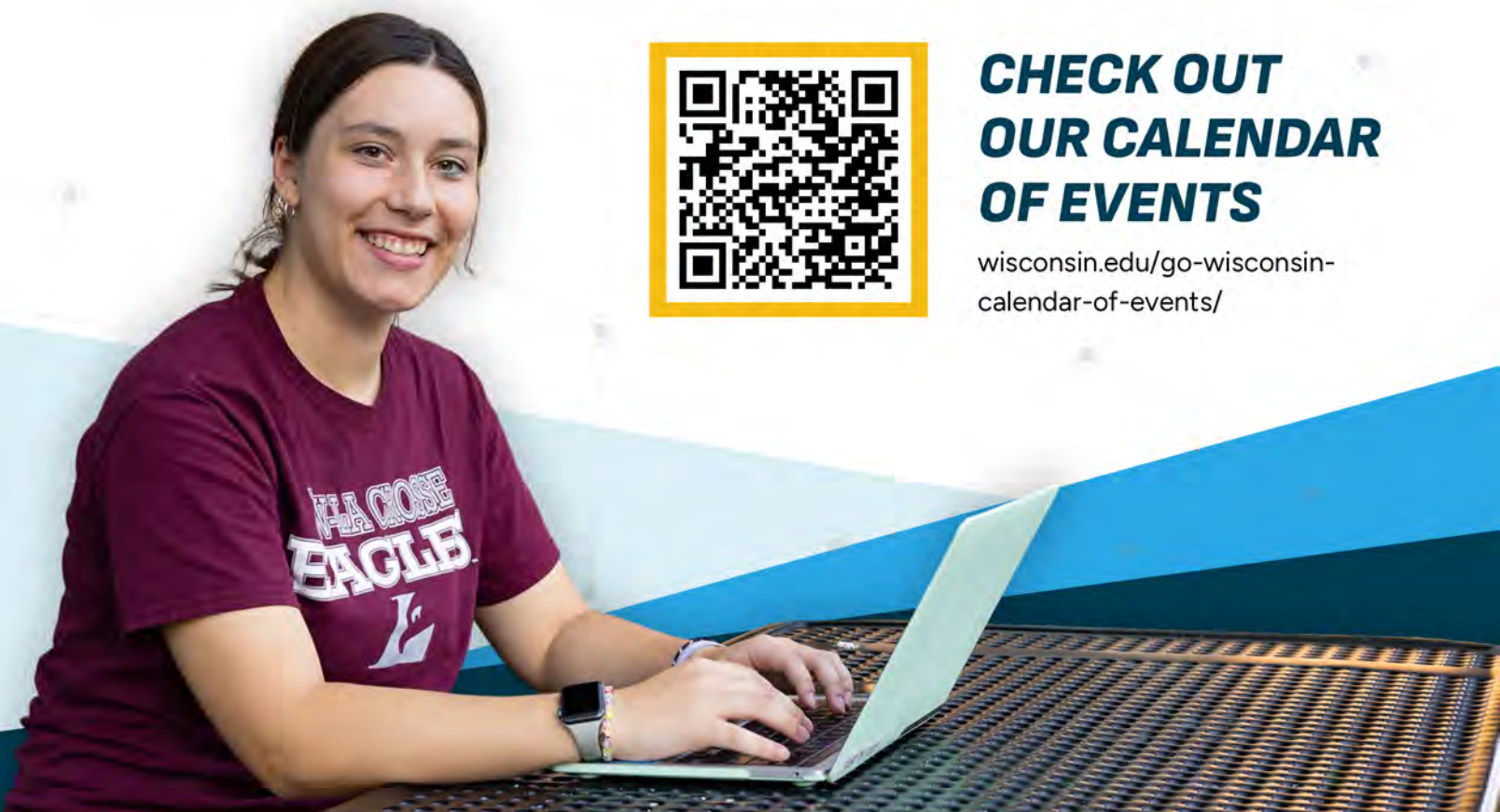

Access to our Direct Admit Administrator Portal:

- The Direct Admit Administrator Portal will give you access to summaries of students admitted through Direct Admit Wisconsin as well as a data download that tracks student activity in real time (e.g. Direct Admit Form completion).
- The Portal also includes tools like self-service updates to high school contacts, Ad-Hoc student corrections/submissions, SFTP set up for PowerSchool, Infinite Campus, and jmc, and a manual file upload function.
- Request a Direct Admit Administrator account. We recommend all high school staff working on Direct Admit Wisconsin create an account.

All staff working on Direct Admit Wisconsin should subscribe to the Direct Admit News email list. This is our primary means of communicating with high school partners and is the best way to stay up to date on key Direct Admit milestones.

JUNIOR YEAR

PREPARE & LEARN

Students can:

- Learn about Direct Admit.
- Decide if they want to participate.
- Ensure they meet eligibility criteria.
- Explore UWs with the Find Your UW online tool as well as campus visits.

OPT-IN TO DIRECT ADMIT

May 1: Deadline for parents/guardians to confirm opt-in or opt-out status.

High school counselors are point of contact on school processes.

SUMMER

ACADEMIC RECORDS SENT BY HIGH SCHOOLS

June-July (or September)

- High schools provide academic records of opted-in students to the Universities of Wisconsin.

DIRECT ADMIT OFFER LETTERS SENT

Early August (or October*)

Direct Admit offers from UWs are listed together in one letter to the student from the Universities of Wisconsin, sent by email and mail.

August 1: Universities of Wisconsin Admission Pathway Portal opens (where students can complete the Direct Admit form as well as submit Traditional Applications)

**Most offer letters are sent in early August, but some are sent in October depending on when the high school transmits academic records.*

SENIOR YEAR

EXPLORE OPTIONS

Students watch for communication from the UWs to which they have been admitted on academics, campus visits, housing, and more.

STUDENTS COMPLETE DIRECT ADMIT FORM

Tells the UWs to which they have been admitted that they are interested and want to learn more.

By November: Recommended submission deadline.

May 1: Final submission deadline.

OPTIONAL: SUBMIT TRADITIONAL APPLICATION

If students did not receive a Direct Admit offer from a preferred UW, or if that UW does not participate in Direct Admit.

RECOMMENDED: FAFSA

Students complete the FAFSA to help UWs offer them the best financial aid package.

STUDENTS CHOOSE A UW

Complete enrollment steps with the UW of their choice by that UW's deadline.

ACCESSING DIRECT ADMIT WISCONSIN OFFERS OF ADMISSION

Students who have received Direct Admit Wisconsin offers of admission must take the next step of submitting a Direct Admit Form. To do so, students must use the Universities of Wisconsin Admission Pathway Portal at **apply.wisconsin.edu/direct-admit**

CREATE A NEW ACCOUNT

If this is the first time a student is visiting the Universities of Wisconsin Admission Pathway Portal to view and access Direct Admit Wisconsin offers, they will need to create a new account at the following link: **apply.wisconsin.edu/direct-admit**

1. Go to the Universities of Wisconsin Admission Pathway Portal at **apply.wisconsin.edu/directadmit**
2. Click on "Create Your Account." Enter in the high school email address in addition to the personal email address. Complete all other fields.
3. Verify both the high school email address and personal email address, and enter the verification codes to continue.
4. Once logged in, from the "DIRECT ADMIT" tab, it will display the list of the UWs the student has been directly admitted to.
5. To start a Direct Admit Form, click on the button "Start Direct Admit Form." Follow the instructions to complete the form.

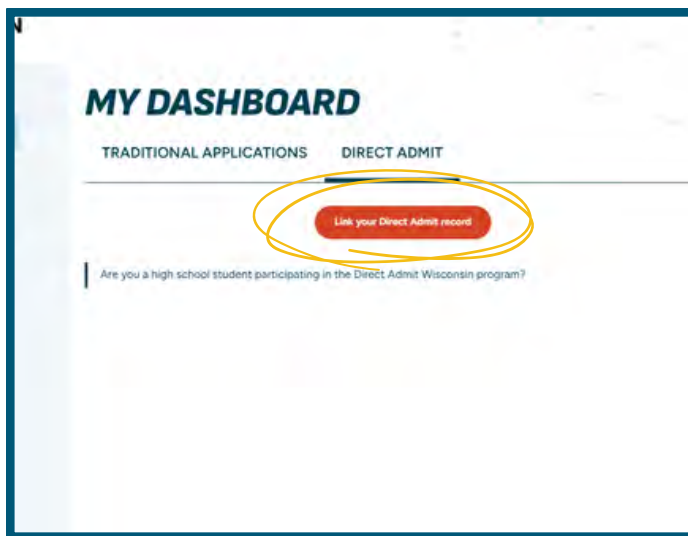

ACCESSING DIRECT ADMIT WISCONSIN OFFERS OF ADMISSION (CONT'D)

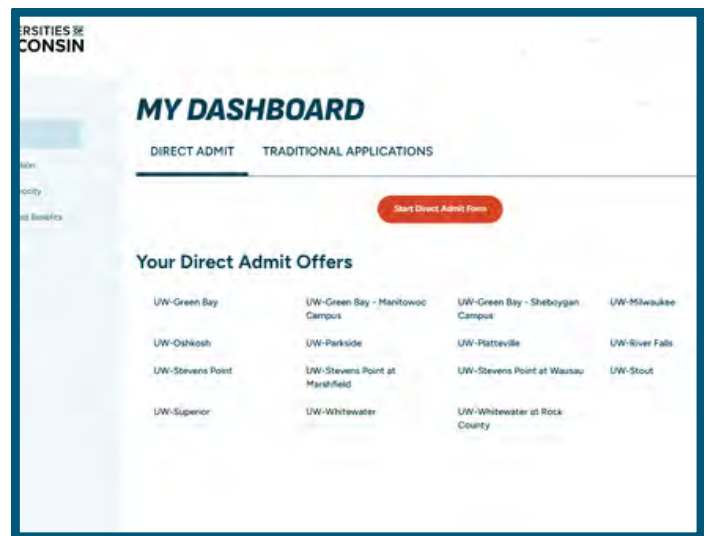
LINK A NEW ACCOUNT

If students have used the Universities of Wisconsin Admission Pathway Portal account before and have an existing account OR created an account on the general website at apply.wisconsin.edu, students will need to log into the account and link the high school record to the account. Students may already have an account if they previously applied for dual enrollment classes at a UW.

1. Go to the Universities of Wisconsin Admission Pathway Portal at **apply.wisconsin.edu** OR **apply.wisconsin.edu/directadmit**
2. Click on "Sign In." Enter the personal email address on the account.
3. Once logged in, click on the "Direct Admit" tab. Then, click on "Link Your Direct Admit Record." Enter the high school email address.
4. A verification code will be sent to the student's high school email address. Verify that the email address is correct, then enter the verification code to continue. If students do not receive the verification code within 5 minutes, check your junk/spam folder or contact Go Wisconsin for assistance.
5. Once the email is verified, from the "DIRECT ADMIT" tab, it will display the list of the UWs the student has been directly admitted to.
6. To start a Direct Admit Form, click on the button "Start Direct Admit Form." Follow the instructions to complete the form.



Example: Dashboard with button to link Direct Admit record



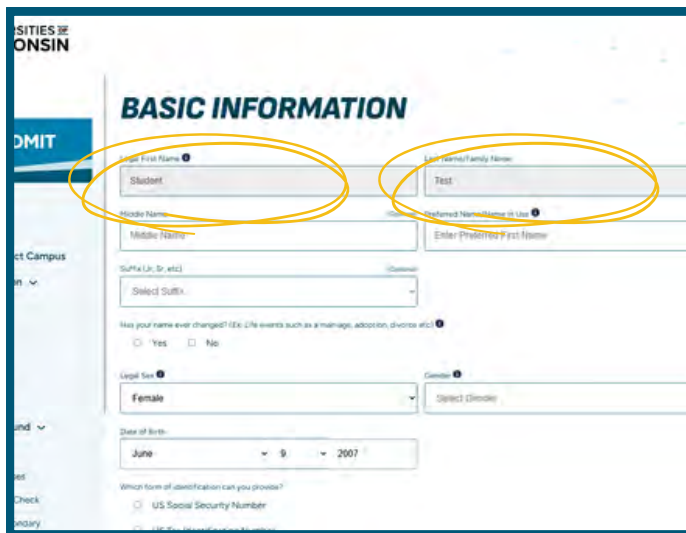
Example: Direct Admit dashboard and Direct Admit Offers

UPDATING STUDENT INFORMATION WITHIN ACCOUNT

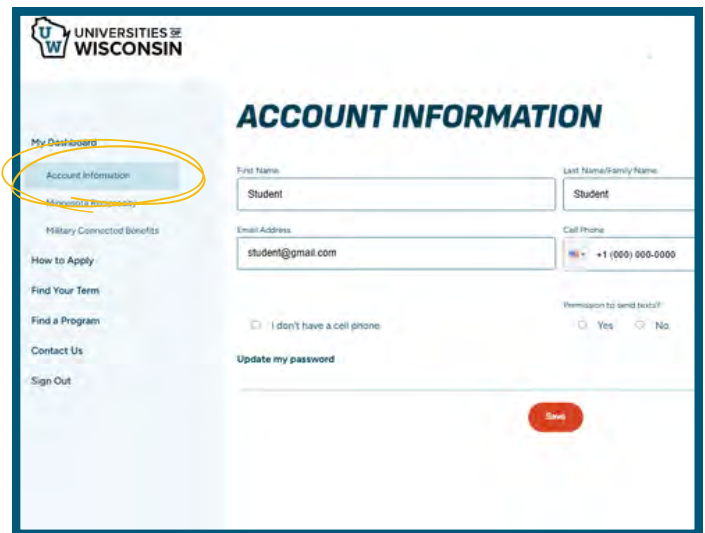
When a student accesses their Direct Admit offers, the portal displays the student information submitted by their high school. In some cases, information such as the student's name or high school may appear differently than expected. If any of this information is incorrect, follow the steps below to update it.

UPDATING LEGAL FIRST AND LAST NAME

The first and last name of a student cannot be updated within the Direct Admit Form itself. If the Direct Admit Form is displaying an incorrect first and/or last name, this information can be updated within the main account under “My Account: Account Information.” Updates to the “Account Information” will automatically update any in-progress Direct Admit Forms.

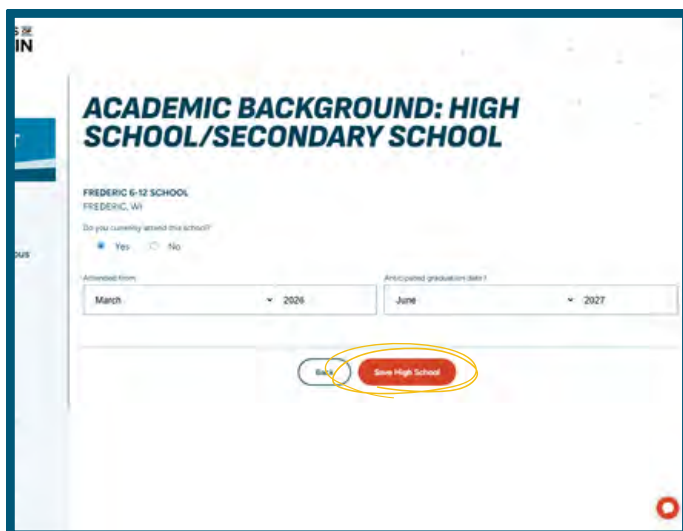

UPDATING STUDENT INFORMATION WITHIN ACCOUNT (CONT'D)

UPDATING HIGH SCHOOL NAME

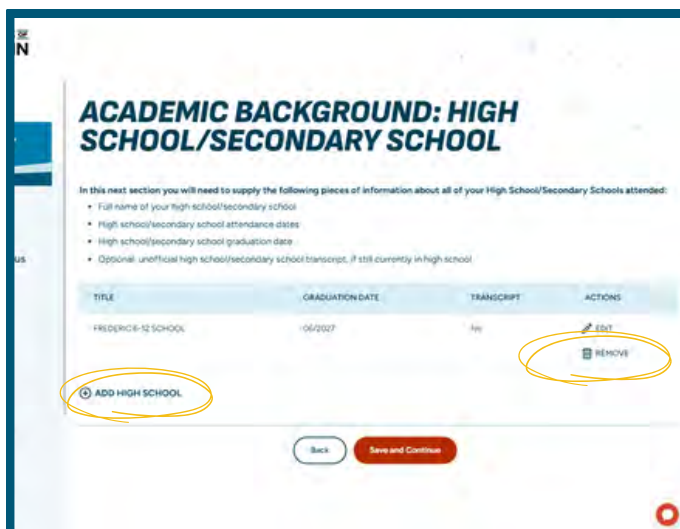
When a student creates a Direct Admit Form, their high school and anticipated graduation date are automatically populated based on the information submitted by their high school. If the high school listed is incorrect, the student can update it within the “Academic Background: High School” section of the Direct Admit Form.

1. Enter in an “Attended from” date. This can be any date. Click on “Save High School.”

2. Once the high school is saved, it will show up in the “Academic Background: High School” page.
3. From the “Actions” column, click on “Remove” to remove the incorrect school.
4. Then, click on “Add High School” to add the correct school.

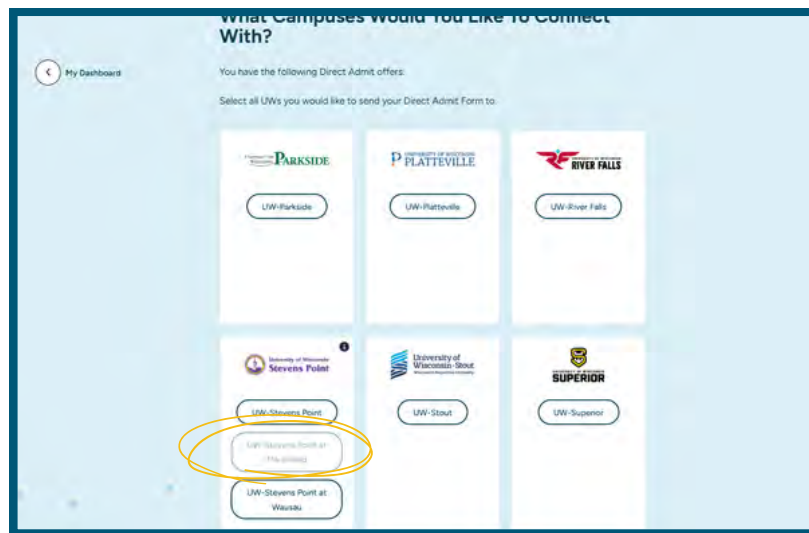


Example: Direct Admit Form - Removing and adding high school

UNDERSTANDING GRAYED-OUT OPTIONS

GRAYED OUT UW ON DIRECT ADMIT FORM

As you assist students with accepting their Direct Admit offers in the Universities of Wisconsin Admission Pathway Portal, you may notice that one or more UW universities appear grayed out or not listed on the Direct Admit Form.

A grayed-out or unlisted UW can indicate that the student either already has a traditional application that is either in progress or submitted for that university, or that the student already has a Direct Admit Form submitted.

If the traditional application is in progress and the student wishes to accept their Direct Admit offer instead, they should delete the in-progress application. Once it is deleted, the UW will no longer appear grayed out on the Direct Admit Form, and the student can proceed with accepting their Direct Admit offer.

If the traditional application has already been submitted, the Direct Admit Form cannot be submitted for that UW. In this case, the student should contact the UW university's Admissions Office and let them know they received a Direct Admit Wisconsin offer. The Admissions Office will provide the student with next steps for accepting their Direct Admit offer after submitting a traditional application for admission.

UNDERSTANDING GRAYED-OUT OPTIONS (CONT'D)

GRAYED OUT MAJOR/PROGRAM ON DIRECT ADMIT FORM

A grayed-out major/program indicates that the major/program is considered competitive and requires the student to select a backup major/program. The student must choose a different major/program as their backup choice before they can proceed with submitting the Direct Admit Form.

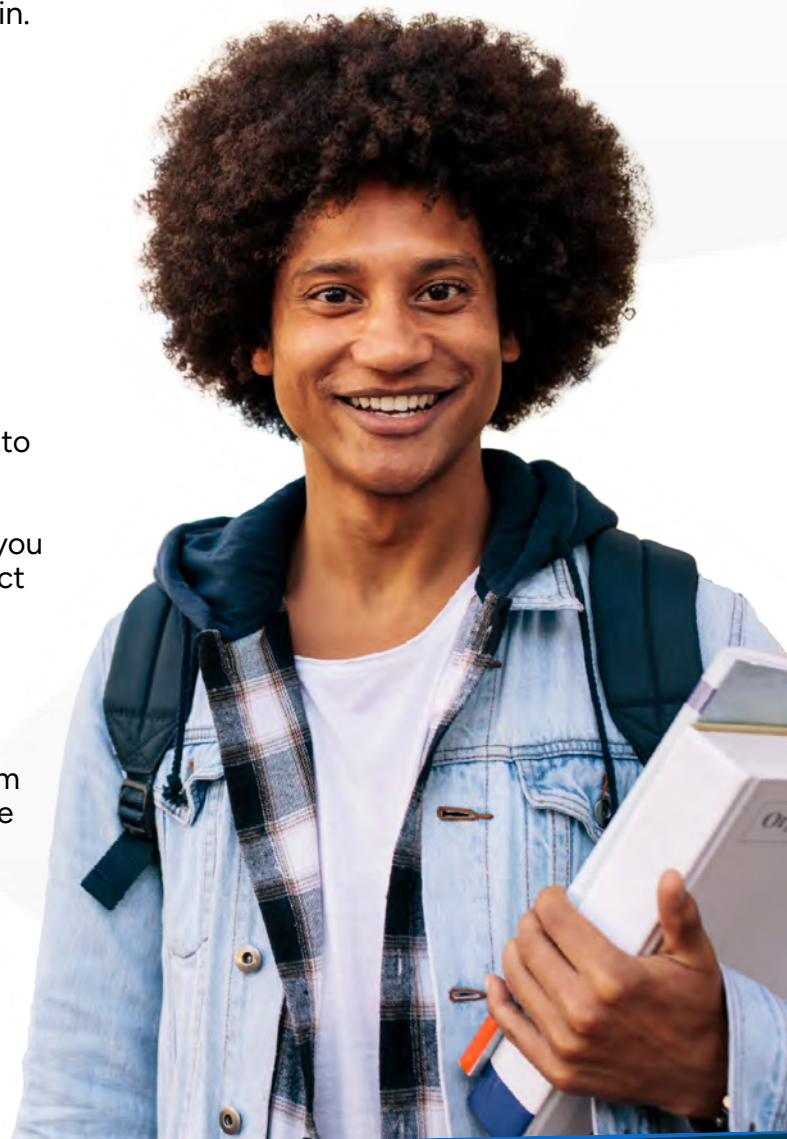

HOW TO PARTICIPATE

- ☐ Connect with your school counselor and agree to participate by May 1 of your junior year.
- ☐ Register for senior year classes and make sure you are on track to graduate and complete the Direct Admit Wisconsin admission requirements.
- ☐ Look for your Direct Admit letter between August and October of your senior year!
- ☐ Once admitted, complete the Direct Admit Form by May 1, 2028, to explore and connect with the UWs offering you direct admission. The Direct Admit Form opens August 1, 2027.
- ☐ Explore financial aid options and complete the FAFSA, if eligible.
- ☐ Make your final decision and say "Yes!" to a UW university.



Frequently Asked Questions

How do I get directly admitted?

You must be enrolled in a participating high school and agree to participate in the program. If you are on track to complete the admission requirements, you will receive an admission offer through Direct Admit Wisconsin based on your unweighted GPA at the end of your junior year.

What is the deadline to opt in/opt out?

Students and families in the Class of 2028 must agree to participate by May 1, 2027. Ask your school counselor how to participate.

Do I need to submit my ACT or SAT scores to participate in Direct Admit Wisconsin?

No, test scores are not part of the Direct Admit Wisconsin admission criteria. However, a student may need to submit test scores to their selected university for scholarships or course placement.

What happens if I am not direct admitted to my UW university of interest, or I want to apply to a nonparticipating university?

Students can and should apply through the traditional admissions application process for any UW university they want to attend that is not listed in the Direct Admit offer letter. The application allows students to provide more information about their academic potential, participation in activities, and life circumstances.

When will students receive their Direct Admit Wisconsin offer of admission?

Direct Admit Wisconsin offer letters will be sent out starting in August and will continue through October 2027.

Is there a deadline to accept my offer?

Yes. You must complete the Direct Admit Form by May 1, 2028.

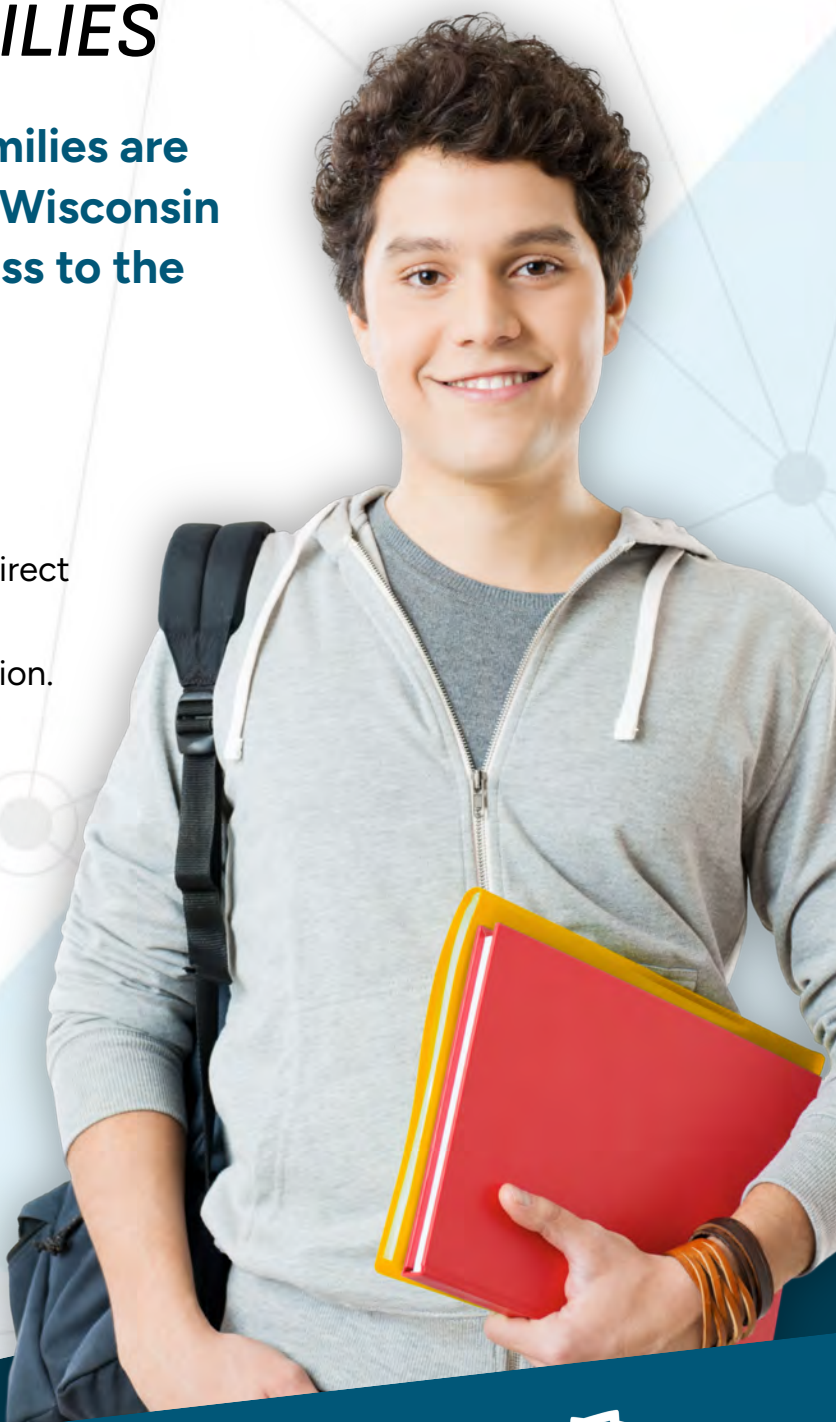
